BELGIAN AND YANK PLEDGE FIDELITY

NEW YORK, June 20.—Cheers rang through the dining room of the Hotel Algonquin last night, at frequent pledges of friendship and fidelity between fighting men of Belgium and those of America, with assurance that neither would cease to give battle to the Germans until Belgium was restored to self rule, and Germany and her allies defeated.

The occasion was a farewell dinner for the officers of the Belgian Armored Motor Car Corps, members of

the first contingent of Belgium's troops sent into Russia when that country was a fighting ally. The host was Major Leon Osterrieth, chairman of the Belgian Military Mission. The corps recently arrived here from San Francisco, escorted by American officers, and in a few days will start for France. About 300 enlisted men of the command are at Fort Totten, and most of them, as well as their officers, have wives and families, from whom they have heard nothing in many months.

U. S. MEN, TRYING TO ESCAPE, SHOT, GERMANS REPORT

THE HAGUE, June 21.—A report has reached here which asserts that captured American soldiers have been shot for attempting to escape.

The Weser Zeitung publishes a story alleging that so-called German, or rather, German speaking Americans are busy in Germany and Switzerland as agents' provocateur trying to create trouble by their actions.

The paper says one was caught on a train the other day and that they travel as German coal and iron agents and try to buy up Swiss machinery, making advantageous bargains and offering not to claim the machinery for another year or two. If the factory refuses the report says, it is threatened with no coal or iron, thus creating a bad feeling for Germany.

The Deutsche Tages Zeitung says that the Americans were put on the Chateau Thierry for the moral effect and to fulfill Premier Clemenceau's promise of American help.

The paper says the communique was not very encouraging and that the attack was made with the support of the French as they would not be allowed the responsibility of attacking alone.

It adds:

"We are of the opinion that the Americans, perhaps a division, have been placed on the French section of the front and did not undertake the attack alone. It would have had a good moral effect to announce the American success after Clemenceau's speech."

TEXAS SHERIFF HUNTS MAN IMPERSONATING HIM IN ILLINOIS CITY

CHICAGO, June 21.—Sheriff James Baker of Bowie county, Tex., arrived here last night to take Henrietta May Edwards, also known as June Cox, back to Texas. She, as a witness in a bootlegging case, learned that a man had been impersonating him several hours earlier. The sheriff after satisfying himself that the woman is not the victim of the "headlines woman murder" case in his county, but the missing witness, began a search, with the aid of the police, for the bogus sheriff.

ESTIMATED GERMAN LOSSES AT 20,000 IN FIVE DIVISIONS

LONDON, June 21.—A correspondent of the Exchange Telegraph Company wired from the front today:

"The Germans yesterday used five divisions (about 70,000 men) between the Aisne and the Forest of Villeret. Their losses are estimated at 20,000."

WANTS 3,000,000 MEN.

WASHINGTON, June 21.—A proposition that not less than 3,000,000 American troops be sent to the war during the next year is made in an amendment to the army appropriation bill introduced today by Senator Fall of New Mexico.

Organization of at least three regiments of mounted volunteers, not of draft age, to protect property in the United States is proposed in another amendment introduced by Senator Fall.

- Rice Nut Loaf.**
- 3 c rice flour.
 - 5 t baking powder.

This map shows the whole 250-mile front over which the greatest battle in history is being waged. The figure 1 is the Ypres front, where the German drive was checked in May. Fig. 2 is the Picardy front, between Arras and Amiens, where the 8th phase of the great battle may be fought. Fig. 3 is the Montdidier-Soissons front, which the Germans are trying to smash in to flatten the line out toward the west. Fig. 4 shows the gain made in the first two days of the battle now being waged—the fourth phase of the offensive. Fig. 5 is the St. Quentin front, where American marines, fighting gloriously, stopped the Germans at Chateau Thierry.
