GERMANS IN ITALY TO COLLECT BOOTY

ITALIAN FRONT, June 26.—According to Italian reports, the Austrians have concentrated all their forces, consisting of seventy-one divisions (about 1,000,000 men) on this front and all their artillery, which is reckoned at 7500 pieces. At present the only Germans identified on battle line are regular battalions, instructed with the continental task of securing to Germany her share of the booty.

The Austrian plan of attack, as revealed in documents found on captured officers, was to carry the whole of the Montello and to establish positions at the end of the first day of the offensive on the Montebelluna-Treviso line.
