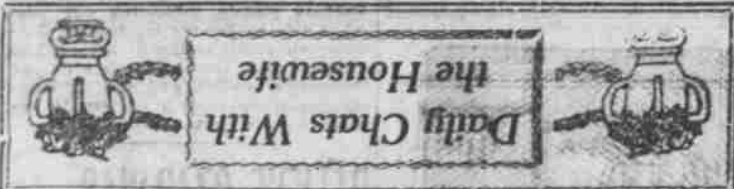

- 2 tablespoons cornstarch.
 - 2 cups milk.
 - 1-2 cup corn or maple syrup.
 - 12 seeded dates cut up small.
 - 1-2 teaspoon salt.
 - 1 teaspoon vanilla.
- Mix the cornstarch with 1-4 cup milk. Heat the remaining milk in a double boiler. Add the cornstarch, syrup, dates and salt, and stir until thick, cover and cook for 20 minutes. Add the vanilla and pour into a dish to cool. Serve five people. Prunes see good instead of dates.
- Spice Cake With Hint of the Sugar Replaced by Corn Syrup.**
- 1-2 cup fat.
 - 2-2 cup sugar.
 - 2 eggs.

- Frozen Custards**
- 1 pint milk.
 - 1-2-3 tablespoons cornstarch.
 - 1-2-3 teaspoons cold milk or water.
 - 1 egg.
 - 1 cup corn syrup or sufficient maple syrup or honey for desired sweetening.
 - 1-2-3 teaspoons vanilla.
 - 1-8 teaspoon salt.
- Scald the milk, and add the cornstarch mixed with the cold milk or water. Cook the mixture over hot water for 15 minutes. Add the egg, slightly beaten, and cook the mixture for 5 minutes. Add the corn syrup and the salt, and stir the mixture well. Strain it, and cool it. Add the vanilla, and freeze the custard in the same way as any ice-cream.

- Green Apples.**
- 1 quart green apples.
 - 2 cups corn or other syrup.
- To the syrup from the apples add the corn syrup and sufficient water to make 1 quart. Place the contents of the apples in a pan, and if the syrup is thick, add more water. Strain through a strainer, and the pulp thoroughly with the liquid and freeze the mixture.

Irrigation Combine Used. BAKER, Ore., July 12.—The Baker Commercial Club has appealed for assistance from the government through Representative Sinnott to revive the Sumpter Valley irrigation project, completion of which would water about 80,000 acres east of Baker.

Horse Expert is Guest. OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, Ore., July 12.—Wayne Dinmore, secretary of the Percheron Society of America and considered one of the best horsemen in the country, was a guest of the animal husbandry department of the college yesterday. The feature of the evening was a horse show in the stock pavilion.

Streetcar Strike Ends. VANCOUVER, B. C., July 12.—Granting to employes the eight-hour day, time and a half for overtime and a wage scale from 40 to 51 cents an hour, ended the streetcar strike in British Columbia early today. Car service has been resumed at most points on regular schedule.

United Support is Plea. SPOKANE, July 12.—A plea for united support of the government in winning the war was voiced by J. C. Kaynor, editor of the Spokane Herald, in the president's address at the opening session here today of the 324 annual convention of the Washington State Press Association.

Draft Boards Scored. CAMP LEWIS, July 12.—Local draft boards who fail to do their duty in considering claims of selected men for exemption, telling them that they can be discharged after their regular camp were scored today by members of the camp exemption board, who declared that many men sent to camp who could and should have been exempted by the local boards are without relief because of the more stringent regulations operative here.
