**Hopes Yanks Capture Mohammedans and Drive Them to U. S.**

CHICAGO, Sept. 26.—I hope the Americans capture the Kaiser and his six wild sons and bring them to the United States to stand trial for the murder of the Lusitania victims and similar crimes, and that all seven of them are hanged by the neck until dead, dead, dead.

So Governor Harding of Iowa, concluded his address at the government war reception before a crowd of several thousand persons. He spoke on "The Kaiser, You Deal."

"The United States ought to write that old filth ball, 'Thou Shalt Not Steal,' into International law and see that it is observed," he declared, also making a plea for celerity in the making of war munitions.

"The more munitions we send over there, the fewer the casualties among our boys," he said.

**BULGARS MUST LAY DOWN ARMS IF THEY GET AN ARMISTICE**

WASHINGTON, Sept. 26.—Bulgaria can get out of the war if she agrees to four conditions, Italian diplomats here informed the United Press.

The most important, they said, surrender all material, permit allied control of Bulgarian railways, permit the passage of allied troops through the Turkish frontier, agree to rest all territorial questions until a general peace at the end of the war.

If Bulgaria is sincere the diplomats said she will accept these conditions which will give the allies a chance to strike at Turkey.

That Bulgaria will accept the demands is thought highly probable and on all sides it is agreed the allies have much to benefit by getting Bulgaria out of the war and exposing the Austrian rear and European Turkey to a vigorous attack.

NEW YORK, Sept. 26.—One of the victims of the Russian revolution is the most famous copy of the Koran in the world. It was stolen from the public library in Petrograd and its whereabouts is now an absolute mystery. Speaking of this volume of Koran, the distinguished Russian scholar Prof. R. F. Oldenburger said:

"The stolen Koran is unquestionably one of the most famous volumes of its kind. By Mussolman throughout the world it was regarded as very holy. I personally have seen, have read of worshippers of Alla walk before the book. A beautiful legend surrounds this volume—the blood spots on its covers are said to be those of Mohammed himself. I don't know these who stole it. I do not believe the story that Turks stole it, as the Soviet government already has promised to return it to any properly designated body representing the Mohammedan church."

Photographic copies of the volume are to be found at the library.

The volume came originally from Turkey, where it was presented to a number of Russian scholars as a gift to the Petrograd public library.

A few days before the theft, a number of American collectors offered \$1,000.00 for it.

**Famous Koran Stolen From Russian Library**

NEW YORK, Sept. 26.—One of the victims of the Russian revolution is the most famous copy of the Koran in the world. It was stolen from the public library in Petrograd and its whereabouts is now an absolute mystery. Speaking of this volume of Koran, the distinguished Russian scholar Prof. R. F. Oldenburger said:

"The stolen Koran is unquestionably one of the most famous volumes of its kind. By Mussolman throughout the world it was regarded as very holy. I personally have seen, have read of worshippers of Alla walk before the book. A beautiful legend surrounds this volume—the blood spots on its covers are said to be those of Mohammed himself. I don't know these who stole it. I do not believe the story that Turks stole it, as the Soviet government already has promised to return it to any properly designated body representing the Mohammedan church."

Photographic copies of the volume are to be found at the library.

The volume came originally from Turkey, where it was presented to a number of Russian scholars as a gift to the Petrograd public library.

A few days before the theft, a number of American collectors offered \$1,000.00 for it.
