HUGHES-GREGORY AIRCRAFT PROGRAM REPORT COMPLETED

WASHINGTON, Sept. 26.—With only a few details yet to be cleared up and possibly a short additional hearing, the Hughes-Gregory report on America's aircraft production program is complete. The report is in the hands of Congressmen today, being prepared for President Wilson. There was a report at the Capitol that portions of it, at least, already were in the president's hands.

Great expectancy is manifest, both at the Capitol and in official circles, in publication of the report. Genissi, at the Capitol declares that the Hughes report is even more severe in its tone than the Senate aircraft investigation committee report. For some time there have been guarded intimations that high representatives of the government would be affected by the Hughes inquiry.

LONDON, Sept. 26.—Investigation of rail strike in Wales may bring out some startling facts that will link the occurrence with activities of pacifists and conscientious objectors.

Some railway men claim to have evidence that pacifists have plotted secretly for months bring about the strike.

URGES EXECUTING KAISER FOR CRIMES

Hopes Tanks Capture Bohemians and Bring Them to U.S.

CHICAGO, Sept. 26.—I hope the Americans capture the Kaiser and his six silly sons and bring them to the United States to stand trial for the murder of the Ludendorff victims and similar crimes, and that all seven of them are hanged by the neck until dead, dead, dead.

So Governor Hardin of Iowa, enclosed his address at the government war exposition before a crowd of several thousand persons. He spoke on "Thou Shall Not Steal."

The United States ought to write that old Biblical law, "Thou Shall Not Steal," into international law and see that it is observed, he declared, also making a plea for continued speed in the making of war munitions.

"The more conditions we send over there, the fewer the casualties among our boys," he said.

BULGARS MUST LAY DOWN ARMS IF THEY GET AN ARMISTICE

WASHINGTON, Sept. 26.—Bulgaria can get out of the war if she agrees to four conditions. Italian diplomats here informed the United Press.

The most demobilize her army, surrender all material, permit allied control of Bulgarian railways, permit the passage of certain troops through to the Turkish frontier, agree to end all territorial disputes with the general peace at the end of the war.

If Bulgaria will accept the demands it is thought highly probable and on all sides it is agreed the allies will have much to benefit by getting Bulgaria out of the war and exposing the Austrian rear and European Turkey to a vigorous attack.

Famous Koran Stolen From Russian Library

NEW YORK, Sept. 26.—One of the victims of the Russian revolution is the most famous copy of the Koran in the world. It was stolen from the public library in Irkutsk and its whereabouts are now an absolute mystery. Speaking of this volume of the Koran, the celebrated Russian scholar Prof. R. F. Oldenburg said:

"This stolen Koran is unquestionably one of the most famous volumes of its kind. By Moslems throughout the world, it was regarded as very holy. I personally have seen hundreds of worshippers of Allah walk into the public library and bow before the book. A beautiful legend surrounds this volume—the blood spots on its covers are said to be those of Mohamet himself. I don't know the motive that may have impelled those who stole it. I do not believe the story that Turks stole it, as the soviet government already has promised to return it to any properly designated body representing the Mohammedan church."

Photographic copies of the volume are to be found at the library.

The volume came originally from Turkey, where it was presented to a number of Roman scholars as a gift to the imperial public library.

A few days before the theft, a number of American collectors offered \$10,000 for it.
