

# BRITISH ARMEN VISIT GERMAN NAVAL BASE

## LONG RECONNAISSANCE FLIGHT MADE OVER HELIGOLAND; 87 PLANES, BALLOONS DESTROYED

Royal Air Force in Conjunction With Navy Carries Out Belgian Offensive Bombing Ports and Airdromes.

LONDON, Oct. 1.—British air forces have carried out a long reconnaissance flight over Heligoland, German naval base, it is reported today in an official statement dealing with land and sea operations of aviators. French and British fliers brought down or destroyed 87 enemy planes in addition to setting fire to a number of observation balloons, it is announced.
