FRENCH ADVANCE IN CHAMPAGNE, ON VESLE

Attack Resumed at Daybreak, Villages Captured.

PARIS, Oct. 3.—The French continue to advance in the Champagne and Vesle regions, said a communication today. They have captured Challerange and Bolive. The French resumed their attack at daybreak this morning.

A communiqué today said, "On the front north of the Vesle the French continuing their advance took Lids. In the region of La Flette above Etrimes a violent German counter attack was unavailing."

Saboteur May Get Hospital. SALEM, Oct. 3.—While apparently Saboteur cannot secure a commutation at the state fair grounds prospects seem to be bright for the establishment of a reconstruction hospital there, according to a telegram received by the Salem Commercial club from Senator Chamberlain. He says the surgeon-general seems to consider there are excellent possibilities in the suggestion for the location of such a hospital and the matter will be investigated further.

BULGARIA PRISONERS STILL AID ENTENTE

MILAN, Oct. 3.—Bulgarian prisoners will continue to work for the entente under armistice terms, newspapers today learned, but Bulgaria must release all entente prisoners. The acquiescence provides for the withdrawal of Austro-German troops from Bulgaria within four weeks.

Many Seamen Are Stranded. SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 3.—Superintendent Charles F. Mann of the Seamen's Institute at Honolulu, has sent a protest to Washington concerning sailors who have been shipwrecked this year in the South Pacific and left to shift for themselves in Honolulu. ROOSEVELT MAY COME ON. SPOKANE, Oct. 3.—"There is a chance that Theodore Roosevelt will visit Spokane during the fourth Liberty bond drive," said George F. Harcourt, district chairman, today. "I telegraphed Mr. Roosevelt today, asking him to come to Spokane after his visit at Billings, Mont., on October 5. I communicated with J. A. Swallow, of Seattle, state chairman, today, and he will try to have Mr. Roosevelt visit Tacoma and Seattle during the drive."

CHARGES OFFICERS WITH GRAFT, FOUND GUILTY BY COURT

PORTLAND, Oct. 3.—Stanley Davis a captain from Lewiston, Idaho, who made sensational graft charges against spruce division officers, was found guilty by court martial of speaking disrespectfully of superior officers and divulging identity while making secret investigations. He was sentenced to the loss of two-thirds pay for three months. The court guardhouse sentence was suspended.

"PROPUSK" IS BIG WORD IN RUSSIA

(United Press Staff Correspondent) NEW YORK, Sept. 30.—"Propusk!" That is the word that strikes terror into the Russian heart. There was a time—when the Romanoffs still ruled Russia—when another word performed the same function. That word was "passport." The revolution abolished that. One needs no passport to live in Russia now, but if he wants to go about he will have to have something else. He must show the holy propusk—the pass. One can acquire quite a beautiful collection of propusks, of all colors and for all purposes, by living just one week, either in Petrograd or Moscow.

Large Collection Advantageous. And it is best to be fortified with as large a collection of propusks as possible. A propusk that may be even 6 months old is a useful thing, as long as it bears some imposing looking stamp of some soviet or government organization.

The propusks I had for admission to various government buildings, secured me in good stead in places admission to which they were never intended to give. But as 99 per cent of the soldiers who examined them at various entrances could not read anyhow, they proved mighty useful. Whether I wanted to enter Smolny, the Tauride Palace or the Ministry of Foreign Affairs I always found that a propusk issued to me a month before for admission to places far from the aforementioned ones proved a real talisman.

Useful in Raids.

Particularly useful was my collection of propusks during the frequent raids of the bolsheviks on my hotel, i. e., about every night. Despite the fact that all entrances and exits of the hotel were barred by armed soldiers or red guardmen, I needed only to pull my propusk collection on the "tsarisch commissar" to obtain complete liberty of action. Only once did my propusk seem about to fail me, and that was on the occasion of an important meeting of the soviet in Petrograd, when the bolshevik commissary wanted to know to what party I belonged before permitting me to proceed to the meeting. My imposing propusk array, however, conquered even him.

I knew of a man in Petrograd who obtained a propusk to see one of the prisoners in the Peter and Paul fortress. He got in all right, but found he had to have another propusk to get out. He stayed in.

The propusk is the bane of the Russian's life. The redeeming feature about it is that the soldier cannot read them, so that very often one could, if sorely pressed get by on a Chinese laundry check.
