BRITISH BOMBERS CONFINE ATTACKS TO MILITARY OBJECTS

LONDON, Oct. 12.—"Clouds save Cologne from attack," reads the headline of a newspaper article detailing a recent air raid carried out by British air forces.

"What really saved Cologne," says a semi-official statement of the Royal Air Force, "was the British refusal to initiate Germany's outrageous policy of indiscriminate bombing. The British squadron, finding it impossible to observe and range upon their objectives of military importance, refrained from the casual bomb dropping which might have hit the hospitals or children."

NOTICE OF REFERENDUM ORDERED BY PETITION OF THE PEOPLE TO REPEAL ORDINANCE NO. 918.

A referendum petition having been filed with the Recorder of the City of Pendleton on February 5, 1917, for the repeal of Ordinance No. 918, and transmitted to the Common Council, which took no action thereon, a vote shall be taken on said referendum, ordered by petition of the people at the next regular city election.

The following is the form and number in which the measure will be printed on the official ballot:

To repeal Ordinance No. 918, granting the Standard Oil Company, a corporation, permission to locate, erect, operate and maintain warehouses, tanks and other necessary buildings on certain lands within the City of Pendleton, for the storage and distribution of Petroleum and its products and other kinds of merchandise.

The full title and text of such measure is as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 918.

"An Ordinance granting to the Standard Oil Company, a corporation, permission to locate, erect, operate and maintain warehouses, tanks and other necessary buildings on certain lands within the City of Pendleton, for the storage and distribution of Petroleum and its products and other kinds of merchandise."

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF PENDLETON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Standard Oil Company, a corporation organized and existing under and by the laws of the State of California, and authorized to do business in the State of Oregon, is hereby granted permission, The powers, rights and privileges granted in Section 1 of this Ordinance are granted subject to the condition that in accepting the same, the said Standard Oil Company, a corporation, shall be bound to pay to the City of Pendleton, for all damages to any person, persons, association or corporation, which may be caused in any manner by or growing out of the use
