REAL INTENTIONS EVIDENT

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12.—The planned accession to Finland's throne of Prince Charles of Hesse is pointed to by Scandinavian and Swiss newspapers showing the utter lack of sympathy or understanding by Germany of American ideals. Berne newspapers declare the Finnish move shows the real intentions of the Germans and will neutralize any diplomatic coup they may attempt. The determination of German imperialists to complete their hold on Finland is causing anxiety to other nations.

Backbeet Gingerbread

- 2 cups buckwheat,
 - 1 teaspoonful soda,
 - 3-4 teaspoonful salt,
 - 2 teaspoonful ginger,
 - 2 tablespoonful shortening,
 - 1 teaspoonful cinnamon,
 - 1-2 teaspoonful cloves,
 - 1 cup sour milk,
 - 1 cup molasses,
 - 1 egg.
- Sift together the dry ingredients. Combine the milk, molasses, melted shortening and egg, and add the liquid to the dry. Beat the mixture thoroughly and bake in a moderate oven. This gingerbread will have the characteristic flavor of buckwheat. One cup of cornmeal may be substituted for one cup of buckwheat.

To repeal Ordinance No. 919, granting the Standard Oil Company, a corporation, permission to locate, erect, construct, maintain, warehouse, tanks and other necessary buildings on certain lands within The City of Pendleton for the storage and distribution of Petroleum and its products and other kinds of merchandise.

The full title and text of such measure is as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 919.

"An Ordinance granting to the Standard Oil Company, a corporation, permission to locate, erect, operate and maintain warehouses or tanks, or both and other necessary buildings on certain lands within The City of Pendleton for the storage and distribution of Petroleum and its products and other kinds of merchandise, and distribution of the same."

SECTION 1. The Standard Oil Company, a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of California, and authorized to do business in the State of Oregon, is hereby granted permission, subject to certain conditions herein expressed, and is hereby authorized and empowered to locate, erect, operate and maintain warehouses, tanks and any and all other necessary buildings or structures; all such buildings and warehouses to be constructed of concrete brick or hollow tile, on the following described property, to-wit: Lots 2, 3, 4, 7, 10, 11 and 12 in Block 110 of said Reservation, in addition to the Town of Pendleton, all in The City of Pendleton, Oregon, and to use said premises for the storage and distribution of Petroleum and its products and other merchandise for a period not exceeding fifteen (15) years.

SECTION 2. The powers, rights and privileges granted in Section 1 of this ordinance are granted subject to the condition that in accepting the same, the said Standard Oil Company, a corporation, agrees to pay and hold harmless The City of Pendleton from all damages to any person, persons, association or corporation, which may be caused in any manner by or growing out of the use and occupancy of the said premises for the purposes herein stated; and in the event of suit or action against the said City for any such damages, the said Standard Oil Company, a corporation, agrees to defend such suit or action at its own expense and cost, and if any judgment shall be rendered against said City in any such suit or action, the said Standard Oil Company, a corporation, shall become final.

VOUZIER'S CAPTURE AIDS PERSHING TO CLOSE ENEMY EXIT

NEW YORK, Oct. 14.—Vouziers' capture as a result of American and French pressure on the western flank of the Argonne massif is Pershing's important success since he began operations to close the German exit from France via Luxembourg. The allies are now in a position to begin the encirclement of Argonne's northern extension which is delaying advance towards Stenay, where the Luxembourg highway crosses the Meuse.

Stenay can now be approached from the southwest by Vouziers and also from the south along the Meuse. Franco-American successes here are having a decisive influence on Hindenburg in Champagne to Vouziers westward to the Rhine sector. Hindenburg is shortening the German lines in Champagne to find more troops to guard the roadways to Stenay. Tethel will be the next big German center in Champagne to fall. Therefore there will be no important point of resistance on the Meuse railway until Mezieres itself is reached 23 miles further north.

Drastic Rules for Eating Places.

PORTLAND, Oct. 14.—Sweeping, drastic regulation of all public eating places of the United States, promulgated as orders enforceable by law and through food supply control, are announced to become effective one week from today.

An absolute ban on the sugar bowl, the serving of more than one kind of meat to a patron, serving of double cream and the burning of waste food is promulgated.

The serving of bread, toast or bacon as a garniture, or of more than specified amounts of bread, butter or American cheese is forbidden.
