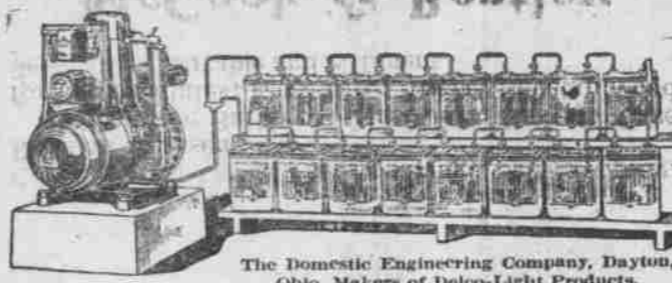

**Box Factory Will Rise**

MEDFORD, Nov. 29.—John R. Tomlin of the Tomlin Box Company, has purchased a tract of about five acres of land at the Crater Junction of the Pacific & Eastern and Southern Pacific railroads from the Big Bend Milling Company and will soon begin the erection of a large box factory.

**L. W. W. Trial Postponed**

SACRAMENTO, Nov. 29.—The Industrial Workers of the World conspiracy cases, set for trial December 2, has been continued until December 9 because of the illness of United States District Judge William Van Fleet, of San Francisco, who was to have been the trial judge. United States District Judge F. H. Rudin of Spokane, Wash., will take the place of Judge Van Fleet, it was said.

**Industries Closed Down**

MARSHFIELD, Nov. 29.—Much uncertainty prevails here regarding the lumbering business and the closing down of several industries indicates that new bearings are established. The North Ben Mill & Lumber Company has shut down until after the holidays and today the Buehner Lumber Company closed its logging camps at Allegany and Lakeside. These retracements throw between 200 and 400 men out of employment.

**More Pay for Hello Girls**

SALEM, Or., Nov. 29.—Postmaster-General Hazelton advised the public Service Commission by telegraph today that he has made effective as of November 15, an increase of wages for telephone-operating employees of the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph Company and asks the commission to make its forthcoming order increasing the telephone rates retroactive so that the rates will also apply as of that date to cover the increase in wages.

**Hunting Violation Costly**

PORTLAND, Nov. 29.—It has cost C. E. Clapp \$25.00 for and may cost him 500 more for hunting without a license within the Malheur Lake Bird reservation in Harney county, according to word received yesterday at the State Fish and Game Commission. On November 16, Clapp was found by state and federal officers killing ducks on the reservation. He was fined by Justice of the Peace Rymer, of Volgate, for not having a license. The maximum penalty under the 84th section of the United States penal code which forbids shooting on bird reservations is \$500 fine and six months imprisonment.

**Spent Nine Days on Raft**

PORTLAND, Nov. 29.—Showing in lost weight and streaks of gray hair the result of terrible experiences after the wood steamer Dumaru was blown up 12 miles off Guam, Ladrons Islands when bound from San Francisco for Manila, Chand Banfield, of her crew, has returned to his Portland home. He says the Dumaru, which was built here at the Grant Smith-Porter yard, was struck by lightning October 15, about 5:15 o'clock in the afternoon, and for nine days and a few nights he and a few companions were adrift on a life-raft, being rescued by the transport Logan. They suffered terribly from thirst.

**Eugene Dormitory Burns**

EUGENE, Or., Nov. 29.—Thirteen girls and their matron narrowly escaped severe injury, or death, in the fire which totally destroyed the main women's dormitory of the Eugene Bible University at an early hour this morning. They escaped only by cutting the wire screening on the sleeping porch and fleeing in their night-clothes.

**Bond Scalpers, a New Evil**

PORTLAND, Nov. 29.—With hundreds of workers released from the shipyards, bond scalpers are eagerly developing a market for equities or partial payments on bonds of the fourth liberty loan, and are paying prices that amount to robbery, according to information gathered by Robert H. Smith, executive loan manager for Ufecon.

**Manager Smith Yesterday called a meeting of representatives of reputable bond houses of Portland to consider plans whereby the emergency may be met and the original purchasers, now out of work, may receive full value for their equities.**

**Yakima Locates Gas Flow**

YAKIMA, Nov. 29.—A well between 280 and 300 feet deep on the farm of I. S. Pae, in the Ahtanum valley, several miles southwest of this city, is giving off a considerable flow of gas. The well was drilled recently for a water supply for the farm, and without any expectation of finding gas.

**Decline of 40 Per Cent Between 1913 and 1916**

A decrease in Germany's live births from 1,829,000 in 1913 to 1,102,000 in 1916—a falling off of 40 per cent—is revealed by figures compiled from German sources by the British local government board and published in the Monthly Labor Review of the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United States Department of Labor. During the same period the decrease in the number of live births in England and Wales was 10.9 per cent.

In the effort to reduce infant mortality the German authorities have undertaken three schemes—maternity grants, increased work in welfare centers for women and children, and special provision of suitable food for expectant or nursing mothers and for young children.
