**NO TENDERNESS IN TERMS FOR HUNS**

LONDON, Nov. 30.—There will be no "attitude of tenderness" toward Germany in the terms Britain demands, Walter Long, secretary of state for the colonies declared today. In speeches in Bristol he advocated a solution of the German colonies question by their inclusion in the British empire. "Where natives have been consulted, they are overwhelmingly in favor of this," said Long. "I can assure you there is no need for anxiety that any tenderness will be shown toward Germany."
