### MUNITIONS TOILERS RECUPERATE BY TILLING FARMS

LONDON, Nov. 14.—(By mail).—The English girls who have toiled so hard making munitions to back the boys have not only given their time and their work, but many of them have given their most precious possession—health. An interesting and successful experiment has been made in transferring groups of girls from munition factories to work on the land. The doctors had recommended that these women should get into the open air, where they would have a chance to recover their original vitality. The women's branch of the food production department has given the care of these girls special attention. So successful has the experiment been the welfare workers of these respective branches of women's labor are establishing centers on the same line so that the good work of restoring munition girls to health may be continued.

### French Industry is Soon to Reorganize

PARIS, France, Dec. 9.—French industrial concerns in the region recovered from the Germans are to be reorganized and opened as quickly as possible.

Two commissions composed of business men from the larger towns evacuated by the Germans are working on a plan for resumption of work in factories that had been in Hun hands.

These factories have been divided into four classes—(a) factories that can be completely repaired; (b) those which will be difficult to repair; (c) those where serviceable material remains; (d) those which can be operated in a short time.

Factory owners have been furnished with questionnaires and they are classes according to answers.

### Strikers Return to Work

OAKLAND, Dec. 18.—After having been out two weeks because of differences with the company, 2,000 striking boilermakers returned to work today at the plant of the Bethlehem Shipbuilding Corporation. The men agreed to return pending mediation of their differences by H. A. Brotherton, examiner for the United States Shipping Board.

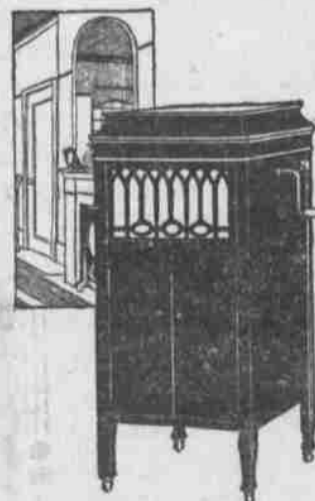

### Portland Will Quarantine Flu.

PORTLAND, Dec. 10.—Mayor Geo. L. Baker has decided upon a strict quarantine of Spanish influenza cases wherever they are found in Portland, as a means of checking the spread of the epidemic, which has again become somewhat marked. The necessary ordinance to make the plan effective will be presented to the council Wednesday, and its enactment as an emergency measure will be asked.

### Growers Not Informed.

HOD RIVER, Dec. 10.—While Consul-General Skinner of London, has written, American apple shippers that the British food administration, in setting a price on imported apples, has estimated the freight at \$1.92 a box, the Apple-Growers' Association has received no notice of reduction of freight from the schedule of \$2 per box, as formerly officially announced. A recent announcement of the Canadian ministry of food sets the trans-Atlantic freight charge at \$2 per box.
