Substitute Found: Excels Platinum

WASHINGTON, Dec. 24.—Officials of the War Industries Board said that since the early part of last fall the government has been successfully manufacturing and successfully using a substitute for platinum discovered by chemists of Mellon Institute, Pittsburgh working under the direction of Charles H. MacDowell, chief of the Chemical Division of the War Industries Board, and Dr. E. R. Weidlein.

Platinum, which heretofore has been essential to the manufacture of sulphur acid, and consequently of high explosives, was so scarce here for a time that the government took control and fixed the price at \$165 an ounce, rigidly restricting its distribution.

After the discovery of the substitute, a small plant was built which turns out 100 pounds of sulphuric acid a day and a five-ton plant is now starting up.

The new substance is said in some respects to excel platinum and its cost is about one-third that of platinum.
