## Hog Market Makes Good Jump; Cattle Market Still Firm

**PORTLAND, Feb. 21.**—There was liberal strength in all divisions of the North Portland market during the day and extreme prices were maintained.

While there was nothing reported in the feeder class in the sale market at North Portland during the day, a load shipped in Wednesday by Roland & Son from Sunnyside was held over until a late hour because the holders were in no hurry to sell. With the exception of three head which averaged 450 pounds and sold at \$13.32, there were no other "outlets" in the load and the remaining 31 head sold at \$16.95, a rise of a dime over the previous top, due to quality.
