### CLOCKS GO FORWARD HOUR ON MARCH 30

OREGON NEWS BUREAU, Washington, March 13.—Under the daylight saving law all the clocks in the United States are supposed to be turned forward one hour at 2 o'clock in the morning of Sunday, March 30, and all of the railroads in the United States, including those outside government control will be ordered to make their schedules conform to the new time.

A movement to repeal this daylight saving law was started in the last congress, but the protest from working people in industrial centers pointed in such bewildering numbers to members of congress that the repeal was never pressed. Under the law, the saving period runs to the last Sunday in October, on the morning of which day at 2 o'clock the clocks will be turned back one hour to observatory time.

### "NEW YORK'S OWN" HOME FROM WAR

NEW YORK, March 13.—Fourteen thousand New York soldiers, members of the famous 27th division, who proved that the "Impregnable" Hindenburg line could be broken, arrived here yesterday on the transports Le-

viathan and Mauretania. Maj. Gen. John O'Ryan, commander of "New York's own," said: "The high opinion that has been held of the fighting qualities of American soldiers I believe has been justified," he said. "Our troops were looked up to by the British and the French—and also, I might say, by the enemy."

Initiative and dash of the American troops brigaded with the British in the campaign which began September 29 last for the St. Quentin canal and resulted in breaking the Hindenburg line, were held to have been the "deciding factor" in the war by Brig. Gen. Palmer E. Pierce, commander of the 54th brigade, a part of the 27th division.

General Pierce was warm in his praise of the fighting of the New Yorkers and units from all other states. He said the Germans now were commenting on the "wonderful new discipline" shown by the Americans whom they previously regarded he said, as "bushwhackers."

### British Women May Come to U. S. for Jobs.

LONDON, Feb. 17.—(By Mail)—Approximately 130,000 female clerks will be discharged by the government within the next three months as a part of departmental demobilization. Many are expected to emigrate to America because of the small number of positions open to them in England.

### BIG PAPER MILL AT SALEM PROPOSED

SALEM, March 13.—Charles K. Spaulding of Salem, P. W. Leadbetter of Portland and others are interested in a proposed large paper mill project for Salem, according to reports in circulation here. Plans for building a paper mill here were formulated prior to the war and have now been revived, with probability that the paper mill will be constructed at Front and Trade streets, on the site of the old flouring mill. Those interested in the proposition are connected with the Charles K. Spaulding Logging company and the Crown Willamette paper mills.

### HIGHER TYPE TEACHER EDUCATORS WANT

WASHINGTON, March 13.—The first public meeting of the Association for the Advancement of Progressive Education will be held here tonight. The association, formed to advance a new system in education, which is based upon giving the pupil freedom to develop naturally without undue repression, is sponsored by many of the most prominent educators in the country.

Dr. Charles W. Elliot, of Harvard, is honorary president. Stanwood Conger of the Naval Academy, is executive secretary and Louis Post, assistant secretary of labor, is a member of the general advisory committee. He will preside at the meeting of the association here.

Besides urging the adoption of progressive methods in education, it will be the aim of the association to create a demand for the higher ordered type of teacher and to convince the public that increased school taxes, to support these instructors is justifiable. The movement to establish a federal department of education also will receive the endorsement of the association.

### GERMAN PRESS HOLDS PROPOSED LEAGUE IS AIMED AT GERMANY

WASHINGTON, March 13.—German press reports received at the state department characterize the league of nations "a great disappointment; merely an instrument to maintain the supremacy of England and America."

The Berliner Tageblatt states that the league is a draft of a "league of arms against Germany." The German nation must be placed on an equal footing with the other great powers, the paper declares, and should also be allowed to share in a world police force. The Tageblatt goes on to say that "the treaty is pervaded with a capitalistic spirit."
