HISTORY OF WAR IS TOLD

OF FILM IN GREAT REVIEW
World Struggle Against Prussian Mil-
litarism Screened in "Crashing Thru
To Berlin."

Jack Cohn, film editor to the Uni-
versal Film Manufacturing Company,
is assembling the great war review,
"Crashing Through to Berlin," has ac-
complished one of the most preten-
tious projects in the world of motion
photography. This marvelous offer-
ing which will be shown at the Arcade
theater next Wednesday is the first
authentic history in pictures of the
struggle which began in Europe in
1914, when a mad monarch gave ex-
pression of his lust for world domina-
tion by declaring war virtually against
all of the universe outside of Germany
and Austria.

Mr. Cohn has arranged a feature
which has been heralded as an educa-
tional vehicle of inestimable value to
school teachers and others upon whom
devolves the responsibility of instruc-
ting the youth of America as to the
extent and scope of the undertaking
with which the United States Great
Britain, France, Italy, Russia and
their allies are confronted.

The interesting sequence of the
hundreds of scenes have made "Crash-
ing Through to Berlin," a desired aid
to textbook and newspaper reports of
the struggle. The picture starts with
the funeral of Archduke Francis Fer-
dinand of Austria, who was slain in
1914, and over whom Austria, at the
instigation of Germany, raised an is-
sue which involved all of Europe.

Then follows the Russian mobiliza-
tion, the resistance of the Belgians
when the Germans tried to violate
their territorial integrity, then the
springing into arms. The action con-
tinues as England, Italy and other al-
lies enter the conflict down to the en-
try of the United States and actual
participation of American troops.
