All that did was to make restless, burdened, crippled France so mad that for the moment she forgot her weariness and uncertainty. She watched the police "clean up" with satisfaction. Cottin struck a man France loved, France loves are France.

There may have been a lot of Frenchmen who had no use for Clemenceau politically. There may have been more who thought his stern attitude was a handicap to the kind of peace that would last, and a big factor in preventing the wheels of industry and commerce from getting under way.

But Clemenceau was the embodiment of "Victory." And he was loved by those who detested his policies. And he still is.

BASLE, March 21.—The Bavarian diet will be asked to elect a new premier to take the place of Kurt Eisner, who was assassinated last month.

Although unable to enter the race because his car did not comply with American Automobile Association regulations Ralph de Palma was to drive an exhibition lap half an hour before the race was started at 1 o'clock. In practice he had circled the

course at the rate of 107 miles an hour.

Among the best known drivers who were to struggle for the \$9000 offered in prizes were Eddie Pullen, Cliff Durant, Joe Thomas, Earl Cooper, Louis Leocoeq, Roscoe Sarter, Omar Toft and Eddie Hearne.

The course is 7.36 miles long and the distance 250 miles, making a 34-lap event.

GREAT BRITAIN'S ARMY STILL LARGE

- * LONDON, March 21.—The government announced in the House of Commons that the total strength of effective British troops in the army of occupation in all theaters of war amounts to 992,000 men, including officers.
- * The strength of the British army in France, Belgium and Germany including dominion troops, on February 15 was 1,224,106.
- * The statement says that 197,000 German prisoners are being held by the British commissary department.

GERMANY BARS RUSSIAN RUBLES

BERLIN, March 21.—The ministry of finance, it is understood will recommend to the German National Assembly the immediate enactment of a law barring the Russian rubles from circulation in Germany.

The influx of Russian currency which began in an astonishing manner with the advent of Adolph Joffe, the bolshevik ambassador to Germany in Berlin last summer has been a constant source of annoyance in the circles keenly alive to the bolshevik menace.

DANIELS SAILS FORTH TO STUDY AIRCRAFT

WASHINGTON, March 21.—Secretary Daniels sailed from New York Saturday on the transport Leviathan for France to study during his visit abroad the developments being made by France, Great Britain and Italy in aircraft. Upon his return to the United States about May 1 the secretary expects to begin preparation of an outline of experimental work in aircraft for submission to congress with a request for an appropriation to carry it out.

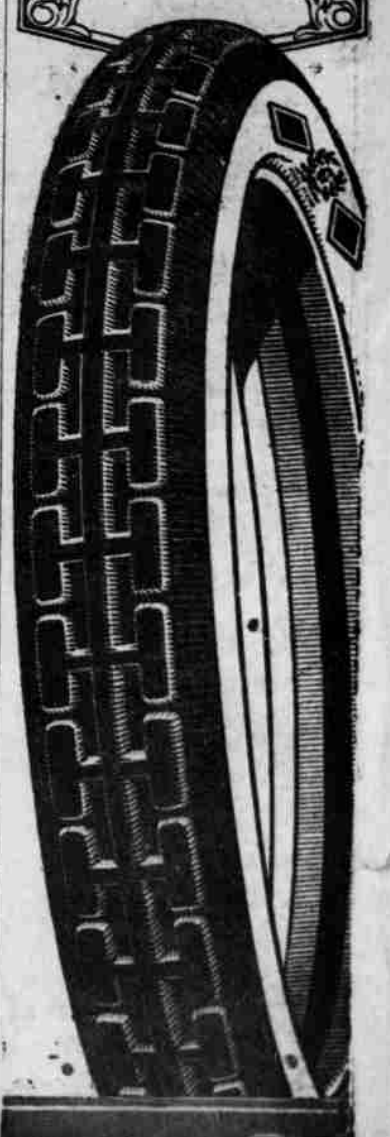
