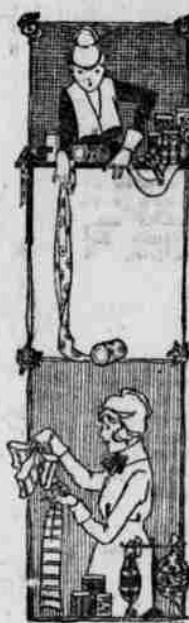

DEADLY STREET BATTLES RAGING IN STUTTGART

BERLIN, April 4.—Deadly street battles are raging in Stuttgart between the spartacists and government troops. According to advices received here the casualties were heavy. The spartacists are reported to have captured the principal handgrenade depot at Stuttgart. Numerous small bands of radicals have been cut off from the main bodies and captured. The government has temporarily restored order in the Ruhr district by rushing 69,000 troops there. The general strike continues to spread, however, extending to Göttingen, Lüttichaven and Friederichshaven.

ENEMY FORCES LOW.
WASHINGTON, April 5.—Indicating the helpless condition of the enemy after the application of Marshal Foch's armistice terms, General March today revealed that allied military forces now total 13,260,000 against 1,125,000 still under arms in the central powers.
