CHEVROLET BEATS TRAIN.

no time in getting No. 8 under full headway. Miller shoved in his starter crank and was soon after the train. Tierney and his companion were scattering gravel a few seconds later and the race was on.
The Chevrolet dashed through Adams 20 minutes later with No. 8 a mile and a half ahead. Eight minutes later Athens was reached.
The big story broke at Weston. Forging ahead at 50 odd miles an hour the little Chevrolet refused to take a sharp curve in a slippery road and went hurtling across a plowed field up to the hubs in mud. Frank in the rear car came thundering up and saw the race lost right there. Glancing back to see if the train was coming, off came his coat and he made strenuous efforts to get the car back into the road. These were precious minutes, with No. 8 racing along in the rear. For fourteen minutes the boys sweat red blood getting the racing car back in the road. A hurried inspection of the car showed no worse damage than a broken windshield.
Jumping into the little car Driver Miles shoved in the starter crank and was off in a second. Milton was reached in 4 minutes, counting the fourteen minutes lost at Weston, and the little car drove up to the Western Union office in 125 minutes. Counting out the time lost at Weston, the actual running time was 71 minutes. The little car averaged 21.05 miles per

gallon, and the average running time was 25.18 miles per hour.

The train boys were broad grins as No. 8 steamed into the station.

"It was the wonderful soldiers who gave us victory. My only merit was to have had faith and never to have despaired. We signed the armistice, in spite of the certainty of crushing

the German armies, to avoid killing one more man because it gave us everything necessary to a French victory."
