## NEARLY HALF ARMY NOW DEMOBILIZED

WASHINGTON, April 12.—Nearly half of the American army has been demobilized to date. The discharged officers and men number 1,741,482, March announced today. He said demobilization is moving faster than it did in the civil and Spanish-American wars. In three months more men have been discharged than in a year following the civil war.

March announced enlistments up to April 10 totaled 7,961. These are equally divided between one and three year enlistments.

The strength of the army April 8 was 1,980,596. Of this a force of 1,326,525 are in the A. E. F. Since the armistice was signed 558,114 soldiers and officers have sailed for the United States.

Health conditions are remarkably good. March stated that influenza has not reached the lowest number since last fall. In connection with reports regarding the casualty rate during the European war, March pointed out that in the hardest battle, the Argonne-Meuse, the casualty rate was 18.3 per cent against 20 per cent at the battle of Gettysburg and 24 per cent at Shiloh.

## GRAND CANYON MUST GO TO WORK

PHOENIX, Ariz., April 12.—The Grand Canyon of the Colorado, long a nationally famous pleasure ground, like Niagara, must go to work. That is the edict of James McMillan, chief engineer of the Grand Canyon Water Development Company, who has completed engineering details of a \$12,000,000 project to make the turbulent waters supply all of Arizona's power demands.

His plan calls for building of a 230 foot dam at the mouth of Diamond creek, in the Grand Canyon—the structure to be but slightly smaller than the famous Roosevelt Dam. It will furnish sufficient hydroelectric power, he estimates, to electrify 500 miles of the Santa Fe railway company's main line in Arizona and to take the place of coal and oil for generating power in every Arizona mine.

**BARBARIAN LOYALISTS KIN**  
BERLIN, April 14.—Bavarian loyalists are rapidly reconquering their country from the communists dispossessed today state. Anti Soviet forces have captured Fierth, Regensburg and several cities in the chief manufacturing districts. The food blockade of Munich is expected to be still progressing.

## OREGON BOYS WANT LAND.

About 900 Ask Information About Project.

SALEM, Ore., April 14.—Of about 20,000 returning soldiers and sailors who have filed with the United States reclamation service, department of the interior, inquiries relative to the land settlement program fixed by the last legislature about 900 are Oregon men, says a communication received by Governor O'Quinn from A. P. Davis, director of the reclamation service. Mr. Davis commends the state for its action and believes that favorable action will be taken by congress at the coming special session. Many inquiries are now being received at the governor's office.
