PORTLAND, Or., April 17.—The first spring lambs of the season made their appearance in the North Portland yards during the day, or four days later in the year than last season. Last season first arrivals sold at \$20 in the North Portland yards, but today the price was \$18.

There was a rather liberal supply of stock in the mutton and lamb alleys for the day, total arrivals being 1403 head compared with none a year ago.

### British Navy's Growth During War Phenomenal

LONDON, April 15.—More than 2,000,000 tons of shipping were added to the British Navy during the war at a cost of nearly \$1,450,000,000, according to a statement today by Sir E. H. W. Tennyson-d'Eyncourt, Director of Naval Construction at the Admiralty.

After the battle of the Falkland Islands, the statement says, the design of the Renown and Repulse was altered from battleships to battle cruisers, the value of battle cruisers having become apparent. The famous "hush" ships—the Courageous, Glorious and Furious—were designed to wipe out German light cruisers and raiders.

### Makes \$60,000 on Booze; Bootlegger Now "Broke"

DENVER, April 15.—Frank Conley, notorious Denver whiskey-runner and bootlegger, who is reputed to have made \$60,000 in the last two years in the illegal whiskey traffic, is broke.

Friday morning when arraigned in police court before Judge Henry Bary on a charge of vagrancy, Conley was unable to pay a fine of \$200 which the courts imposed upon him.

In a statement to the court, Conley admitted having been a whiskey-runner and told the court he had made considerable money, which had been dissipated in fighting charges of bootlegging brought against him.

When it was found Conley could not pay his fine, he proposed to the court that the fine be suspended and that he be permitted to leave town. He promised to take a train out of Denver Saturday for his home in Fort Worth, Texas. The court took the matter under advisement.
