CHINESE WANT FOREST SEEDS

WASHINGTON, April 19.—Flood-stricken China wants seeds from the United States for an active policy of reforestation has been started. With this in view, it is anxious to start a system of seed exchange with the United States. Request for co-operation has been received by the American Forestry association from Forestry the sheriff, advisor in forestry of the ministry of agriculture and commerce, Peking. This work is to be inaugurated along the line of the Peking-Hankow railway.

F. S. Ragsdale, secretary of the American Forestry association, has been notified by the Chinese of the kinds of seed China has to exchange for those which are needed there.

Plans for the help which is to be rendered to France, Belgium and Italy by the American Forestry association in reforesting their devastated areas, are now under way. Secretary Ragsdale has recently returned from Europe.

"No finer memorial can be erected by the American people," he said, "than large tracts of forest in Europe to take the place of those which helped to hold the Hun back from Paris. Inquiries and offers of co-operation are coming in from all over the country. About one and one-half million acres of forest in France have been destroyed by shell fire or used for military purposes and practically all of Belgium's forests having any timber value were cut down by the Germans. Fully 40,000 acres of Great Britain's forests—one-half of her total forest area—went for war work."

ALL HUNGARY WILL SUPPORT BOLSHIEVSKI

VIENNA, April 19.—A dispatch to the Neue Fri Presse declares that all the non-socialist parties in Hungary will support the government for reason, it is said, that it has decided to set against the entente. The rural population is reported to have gone over to the communists.

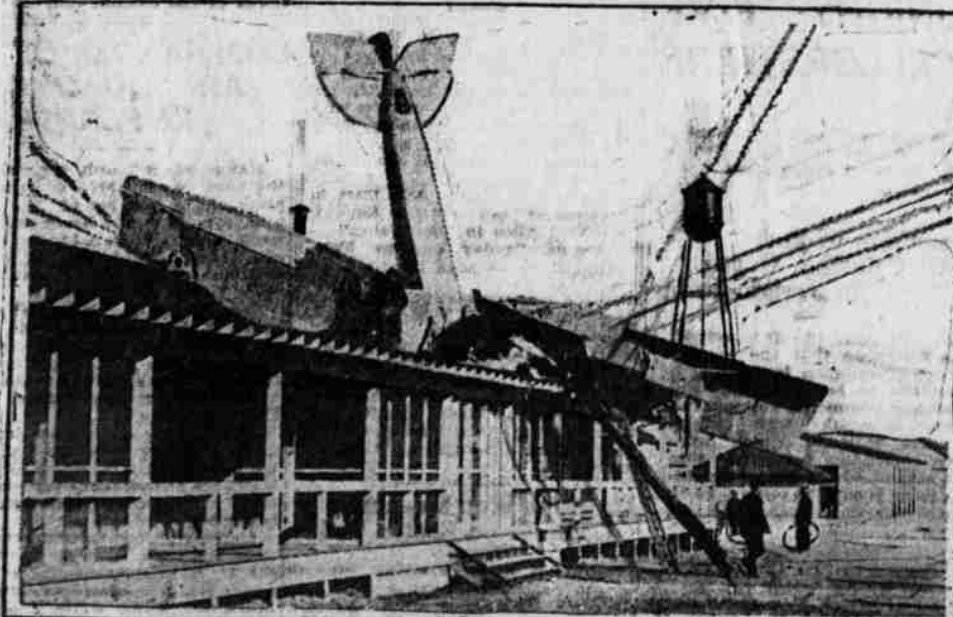
