### Week in Stock Market Considered Very Good

**PORTLAND, April 21**—Total run of livestock at North Portland for the week was 132 cars compared with 127 last week, 133 cars two weeks ago, 117 cars four weeks ago and 75 cars a year ago.  
Run of hogs during the week showed a small decrease from the previous six days' showing and the trend of the market ruled firmer with a further advance in the prices. Sales of top quality were made generally as high as \$19.75 during the period.  
At the closing of the week the market was cleaned up.

**Cattle Trade Firm**  
With a further fractional advance in the price the market for cattle showed strength during the week with tops commanding up to \$14.75.  
Run of cattle in the North Portland yards for the period totaled 1975 head, compared with 2000 head last week and 1915 head year ago.  
While there was little really top cattle available in the trade here during the week, some rather good stuff was in evidence, with the demand especially good for such offerings.  
McMillen-Harmon Livestock Commission company of Kansas City advises of the cattle and sheep trade:  
We had another liberal run of cattle at all the eastern markets Monday and fairly liberal supplies again Tuesday. Quite a sprinkling of pulpers and hay feeders were among the offerings.  
The market was slow and drab from the start and values were barely steady with last week on the best grades of both steers and butcher stuff and lower on the medium and commoner kinds.  
We do not look for much improvement in prices, if any, until May.  
Receipts of sheep and lambs Monday 5000, today about 12,000. Market steady and strong. Top on best lambs \$19.50. Kansas City is practically in line with all other markets, especially Chicago, as their top is only \$19.50 @ 19.45. California fall shorn lambs \$15.50; clipped lambs, ewe, \$12.50 @ 12.25; woolled ewes \$14.75 @ 15.25; wethers, \$14.00.

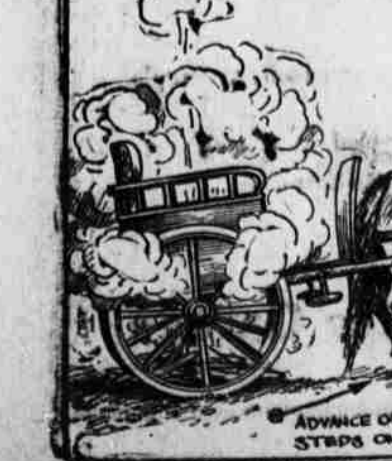

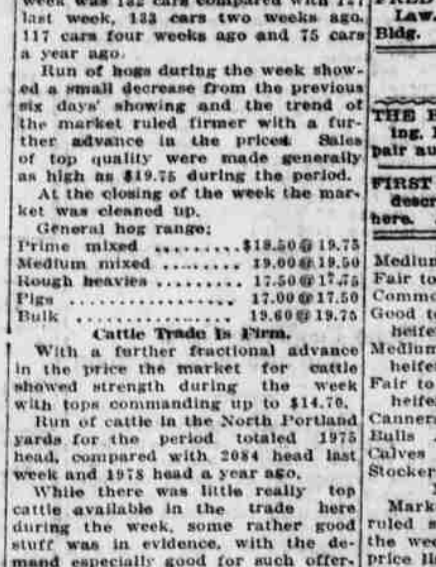
