PORTLAND, OR., April 25.—Total of 135 cars of livestock entered the North Portland yards during the week compared with 132 last week, 127 the previous week and 102 cars four weeks ago. Market for hogs reflected much strength in the local trade with sale of one load of extra good stuff at \$28.50 during the week. While this price was not paid for any other supplies and general market was not quoted above \$26.25 during the remainder of the week, still there was no reason to believe that if the same quality was obtainable as secured the extreme price, that it would not be obtainable again.

Cattle Market Steady. While prices were not quite as high at North Portland for the week as during recent periods, still the general trend of the trade was considered steady. There was a somewhat greater run of supplies in the local yards with a total of 2300 head for the six days compared with 1975 last week and 1375 head a year ago.

With the early approach of the grass cattle season from both the south and the north, stocks of feed stuff are being cleaned up; practically the only remaining supplies
