Week Opens With Cattle Weaker and Hogs Strong

PORTLAND, April 22.—Eighty-four carloads of livestock entered the North Portland yards over Sunday, compared with 100 a week ago, 72 two weeks ago, and 94 cars four weeks ago. Run of swine showed a total of 1890 head, compared with 1710 last week and 2245 a year ago, but the demand was keen. Market started very slowly, with shippers holding out for more money, which killers were unwilling to meet in full. Nevertheless, the trend of the trade was firm, even though Eastern markets were down for the day. General hog range: Prime mixed \$20.50@20.75; Medium mixed 20.00@20.25; Rough heavies 18.50@18.75; Pigs 18.75@20.00; Bulk 20.00@20.75.

Cattle Trade Is Weaker. With killers overstocked with cattle supplies temporarily, as forecast in these reports recently, the market at North Portland did not open at all for several hours, and then trading was slow, with killers inclined to beat them down. At the start it was impossible to say definitely how badly the market was hurt, and early quotations were on a nominal basis. General cattle range: Best steers \$13.50@14.00; Good to choice steers 11.00@11.50; Medium to good steers 9.50@10.00; Fair to good steers 8.00@9.00; Common to fair steers 7.50@8.00; Choice cows and heifers 10.50@12.00; Good to choice cows and heifers 8.00@9.75; Medium to good cows and heifers 6.00@7.00; Fair to medium cows and heifers 5.00@5.50; Canners 3.00@4.00; Common to fair steers 5.50@6.00; Calves 9.00@12.50; Stockers and feeders 6.00@8.50. SPOKANE, April 22.—"My husband no longer loves me," read a note found lying beside the bed on which Mareszono Cicci, Italian section laborer, found the dead body of his wife, Myrtle, 18, and their six-month-old baby, in a converted box car home, 21 miles east of Spokane, on the Milwaukee railroad.

The baby had been shot just back of the right ear. The mother was shot through the mouth into the brain. A .32 revolver lay between the pair. The mother was still clasping the baby in her when found. There was a blood-stained pillow on the bed.

Mrs. Cicci was a Spokane high school girl, daughter of Mrs. A. B. Leonard of this city. She eloped with Cicci in 1917, much against the wishes of her mother.
