TO TEACH CIVILIANS TO SHOOT, U. S. STAGES 1919 TOURNEY



Carl Vrooman, assistant secretary of agriculture, in training on Caldwell range—he's wearing the straw hat in the foreground. This is where the greatest shooting match in the history of this country will be held this summer, at Caldwell, N. J.—"forty-five minutes from Broadway." Thousands of expert marksmen from the army, navy, marines and civilian life will compete for national marksmanship honors, and 25,000 spectators are expected to watch the shooting. Thanks to the national defense act of 1916, government rifle ranges are now open to civilians as well as soldiers and sailors. The navy, which built the Caldwell rifle range, will be host to the visiting riflemen for the first time. Lieut.-Col. William G. Harless of the Marine Corps, who was largely responsible for the development of small arms practice operating with him are the National Board of Promotion of Rifle Practice, a branch of the War Department, and the National Rifle Association. The rifles will begin to crack July 1.

BIG PROPERTY AT STAKE IN LAWSUIT

Heavy property interests are involved in a suit filed today by Earl P. Tulloch against Herman Rosenberg and wife, Manuel Pedro and George A. Hartman, the complaint being filed by J. A. Fee and Carter & Smythe.
The complaint sets forth E. L. Smith and Herman Rosenberg were partners in the ownership of 5443 acres of land and the farming of the same. The land in question was formerly the Pedro ranch south of Pilot Rock. It is alleged that the defendant Rosenberg made no proper accounting of property sold. The estimated value of such property is valued at between \$50,000 and \$75,000 and it is asserted E. L. Smith received but \$3000 as his share. An accounting is asked for, also judgment for what is due the plaintiff, who has purchased the Smith interest, and damages to the extent of \$10,000.
The complaint asked for the appointment of a receiver by the court and Spence Bentley was last evening named as such receiver.
The ranch in question has 1200 acres of fall wheat.

MAY REFUSE WILHELM.
THE HAGUE, May 6.—That Holland will refuse the expected demand to turn Wilhelm over to the allies for trial is indicated in information received from confidential sources today. The government contends the former Kaiser entered Holland as a private citizen and the Dutch law applies to his case.

GARRISON DEFENSE BEGINS.
SEATTLE, May 6.—Rebuilding, apparently for the first time that she is fighting for life and liberty, Rust Garrison, on trial for poisoning Mrs. Grace Stairs, broke down and sobbed bitterly at the calling of the first witness this morning. Thirteen witnesses were called in quick succession. None were cross examined. The state ended its case with startling suddenness at noon.
