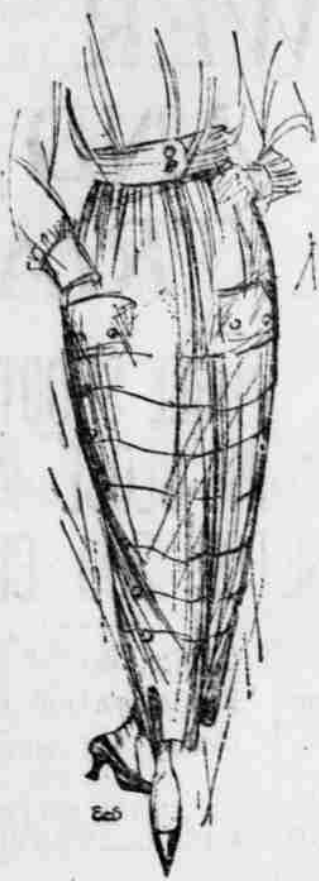

WORLD BROTHERHOOD CONVENTION THEME

CLEVELAND, May 7.—The federal council of the Churches of Christ in America, representing thirty-three denominations and 35,000,000 communicant members, convened here



yesterday. Meetings will continue through Thursday.

"From the World War to World Brotherhood" was the general theme discussed by the 200 Protestant church leaders of the country who are attending the convention. The churches of Great Britain, France, Italy, Belgium and Switzerland, also are represented.

The general war time service of the council will be reviewed with a view to proposing an after-war program. The following four demands of the hour upon the church will be considered:

1. A more effective proclamation of fundamental virtues.
2. A new sense of world responsibility.
3. An effort to understand the Christian social order in America.
4. The increasing co-operation among the churches.

Tonight there will be a mass meeting in Gray's armory, with an address by Robert E. Speer, chairman of the general war time commission of the council, upon the subject, "The Leadership of American Protestantism in the New Internationalism." The representative of the British churches also will make an address. The ses-

sions of the council are being held in Euclid Avenue Baptist church.

THREE SHOOTERS.

long runs at the start yesterday were dropping an occasional easy one today.

Only ten squads were on hand for the opening of the shooting but as the morning advanced, the camera arrived to take their turn at the traps. Lou Rayburn, who gave promise of being a state title contender, was sick last night and did not come down to shoot today.

S. H. Shorman of Salt Lake, started out with the best record this morning, being the only shooter to break his first 50 birds. Mrs. Jones and Mrs. Bowker both brought down a big round of applause by breaking 15 straight in their first trip to the traps. Lee Drake was the only man in their squad to go the straight with them.

The seventh squad, consisting of Jess Troeh, Effman, Shorman, Ford and Bailey, repeated the performance of the first squad of yesterday by running their first 75 straight.

Mrs. Schilling won. Mrs. Ada Schilling, by breaking 23 out of 100 birds, won the women's trophy. Mrs. A. W. Bowker of Heppner, tied Mrs. O. M. Jones for second place, each with 22. The first 50 birds of Tuesday's and Wednesday's shooting counted in this event. Only three women were entered in the shoot.

H. R. Everding, after shooting three frames, received a telegram from Portland saying that his wife is ill and withdrew from the shoot in time to take No. 17 for home.

SIDELIGHTS ON SHOOT

Allen & Knight have on display today an old shot gun carried by Hugh Poston in the Civil War. The man killer is a young cannon, weighing close to 25 pounds and shoots 8 gauge shells. It is a battle scarred old piece and, if anything, Hugh has preserved his looks all these years better than the gun.

The staying power of experience was demonstrated in the Troeh-Spangle contest for the Honeyman trophy. Twice when Troeh slipped, with Spangle shooting second, the Pendleton boy followed suit, tying things again. Troeh shot from the 21 yard line and Spangle from 19 yards.

The trees straight on in No. 2 trap are the hardest background the shooters had to contend with yesterday. The 17 straight which Jess Troeh broke from the 21 yard line and all in the foliage required remarkable accuracy. He stands very close to his brother Frank as a shooter.

Dr. C. F. Cathey, new president of the State association, has held the chair on previous occasions, but in another capacity. The doctor lived in Condon before coming out of the wilderness and was once the interior curator for an Elk's minstrel show there. He has the dignity and poise, they say.

Mrs. F. J. Holohan accompanies her husband to all the shoots but never has taken up the sport in which he is one of the leaders. She does play golf, however, and in the afternoon her eye steals across the landscape from the Round-Up grounds to the links, where several men and women can be seen doing nine or eighteen holes.

Squad No. 3 made its bid for fame today by breaking 99 out of 100 on trap No. 2. Keister was the only man to drop a bird and his was the second bird. The best squad run so far has been 90 straight.

For the second successive day, Squad No. 5 shot through 750 birds with 25 dropped. Their total for the 1500 birds in two days was 1444 dead, an average of 96.26 per cent. The five believe they are the champion at random five men team in the country. The squad consists of Pete Holohan, Abner Blair, Frank Troeh, Guy Chiesman and Lou Rayburn.

Although glad that the title went to one of their own men, members of the Portland Gun Club were as disappointed as the rest of the shooters and audience when France "broke" and dropped five birds in 35. The Arlington man was so busy bringing down birds that he never took off his coat.

THE DALLES POLICE CHIEF FATALLY SHOT

THE DALLES, Ore., May 7.—Chief of Police Gibson was fatally shot at noon today while he and Sheriff Christman were marching two of three men who robbed the Washington, Washington bank, of \$7000 Monday. He died an hour later. The bandits escaped in the excitement following the shooting, but later were recaptured. One was under a building half a block from the scene.
