BANKER PLACES VALUE OF LOVE AT \$50,000

CHICAGO, May 12.—Difficulties of John B. DeVoney, former president of the International Trust & Savings bank, and Miss Ethelyn Landwer, his former stenographer and supposed fiancée, will probably be aired in the superior court, where Roy B. Whitman was sued by the former banker for having alienated the affections of the young woman.

Mr. DeVoney asks \$50,000 damages from Whitman, a former army lieutenant and salesman, who he alleges is responsible for the breaking off of the engagement between DeVoney and Miss Landwer.

Only recently DeVoney was dismissed on a charge of disorderly conduct made by Miss Landwer, who alleged that DeVoney insisted on forcing his attentions upon her. Recently in the announcement of this it was stated that Lieutenant Roy B. Whitman, member of the real estate firm of Ballard & Whitman, was the man sued by Mr. DeVoney.

Roy B. Whitman, the defendant in the suit, is not a real estate dealer and is not connected with Ballard & Whitman.

Duty Doubles Price of Potatoes.

JUAREZ, Mex., May 12.—A baked potato costs 25 cents in the El Paso hotels. In Juarez they may be bought for a few centavos a pound and baked over charcoal stoves. Mexican potatoes are grown by Chinese gardeners in the district west of Chihuahua, shipped here and then reshipped to central Mexico. They sell here for less than half the price of American potatoes in El Paso, but the export duty prohibits their shipment to the United States.
