PORTLAND, May 12.—Total run of livestock was but fractionally greater than the small run of last Monday with a supply of 62 cars compared with 45 a week ago and 54 cars two weeks ago.

There was a rather liberal showing of stock in the nation and lamb alleles for the day, with a total showing of 278 head compared with 1135 last Monday and 1961 a year ago.

A large per cent of the day's arrivals in the sheep division came drifting around—one intent upon firm stock was offered on the open market went at full figures.
