ENID BENNETT HAS DELIGHTFUL ROLE IN "FUSS AND FEATHERS"

A novel role, that of the daughter of a prospector, was selected for dainty Enid Bennett, in her latest Paramount picture, "Fuss and Feathers" which will be displayed at the Alta theatre today. PENDELTON IS LAGGING IN CENTENARY QUOTA

PORTLAND, Ore., May 21.—The PORTLAND, Ore., May 20.—The gigantic Methodist Centenary campaign to raise \$105,000,000 for the rebuilding of the world, more than Northwest at noon today with a total reported of \$1,297,835 of a quota of \$2,455,000. The national total was reported as well over the thirty million mark. Two districts, Olympia and Tacoma, have reported. Virtually 100 per cent of the churches and the districts are now well over the top.

The Dalles district, in which Pendleton, has reported \$45,000 of its \$150,000 quota. The Dalles city has gone over the top with \$10,000 reported on its \$5000 quota. White Salmon, Dufur and Bickleton have also completed their quotas. Reports from 11 churches in the district, among them Pendleton, is lacking at Northwest headquarters.
