Movement of Sheep to Portland Yard Liberal

PORTLAND, May 22.—Movement of sheep and lambs to the North Portland market was liberal over night with a total supply for the day's trade of 1686 head compared with 1041 last week and 402 head a year ago.

Spring lambs continued to hold rather steady at \$15.00 for top quality stuff and there was quite a fair movement at this price while market was picked up within the former price range.

One deck of sheep came from California but did not enter the market, having been purchased in the south by a northern killer.

At \$20.00 for extreme tops and the bulk of the really worth while quality at \$19.75, the market for swine reflected a generally steady tone in the North Portland alleys for the day. Receipts were comparatively small, totaling but 286 head compared with 208 last Wednesday and 672 head a year ago.

Death Certificate Frees Trio of Women Suspects

WASHINGTON, May 22.—Police investigation disclosed the identity of the three women occupying the automobile that struck and killed young Vinson Walsh McLean, 9 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Beale McLean, here Sunday. They are Miss Elizabeth Moore, who drove the machine; Miss Hilda Moore and Miss Emma Riley. Living at Bethesda, 10 miles outside of Washington, they knew nothing of the tragedy or the identity of the boy they had struck until apprised by detectives. They came here from Charleston, W. Va., 10 days ago.

In view of the character of the accident, the coroner for the District of Columbia declared the holding of an inquest unnecessary, issued a certificate of death by accident and directed that the three women be released.

With the death of Vinson, John H. McLean, the second of the McLean children, grandson of the newspaper owner and millionaire of that name, takes the position of the richest boy in America. He is 4 years old.
