EDUCATIONAL PENDLETON

(Editorial in the Oregon Journal)

Because it is the world's round-up city, some folks expect every Pendletonite to be arrayed in a buccaroon costume. The fame of the Round-Up has mislead some aesthetic souls into the supposition that the mayor is clad in sombrero and chuparosa.

Famous as is the Round-Up it is only a side show in Pendleton. Pendleton is an educational headquarters. Each hour of 1200 people into an auditorium to witness a graduating exercise of the high school class, and you have another view of Pendleton.

The program is rich in vocal and instrumental music, rendered mostly

by young men and young women. The selections are from the classics and artistically rendered. A trio in which the instrumentation is cello, violin and piano by three young women is surpassed only by professionals. That was Pendleton educationally last Friday night. The exercises were in a high school building of brick, three stories and basement with modern equipment for manual and other training. The structure, at present cost of things couldn't be built for less than \$200,000.

The spirit of studentism in the high school is exemplified in the case of a young man who made for four

straight years an average standing above 92 out of a possible 100. He is Alfred Koepfen, and he was awarded scholarships in Williamette university and Whitman college. Another case was Miss Laura Kearney, with student standing above 90 as her average for four years' work. She was awarded a scholarship in Reed or any other of the conference colleges, including Pacific university and Albany college. The Lantern cup, an award to the best all round student, went to Edward Strahorn.

They tell you in Pendleton that Dr. J. S. Smith, in his time in that city, was a great factor in the construction of the high school building, and a leader of the educational drives of the city. Three modern grade school buildings are other assets in the school work, to say nothing of a Catholic boarding school of parts and popularity.

Music, art, household science and agricultural courses are in the curriculum. Besides Principal H. E. Inlow, there are 13 teachers in the high school work. Fred P. Austin is city superintendent, and the whole school organization is up to the minute and effective.

Another educational resource is one of the handsomest library buildings in any of the upstate cities of Oregon. The building cost \$40,000 and is part of a county library system with the central library in Pendleton and 14 branch libraries throughout the county. From these libraries, books are sent on application to any home in the county. Permanent branch buildings are at Hermiston and Milton, and the program proposes similar buildings in all the towns of the county.

The maintenance fund provides for the purchase of over 3000 volumes each year, a plan that keeps the library fresh and up to date. No county, so far as known, presents a more democratic library system. The use of books as shown by the library records is growing from year to year, proving how this great agency for educational and social betterment is working out.

The educational organization of Pendleton is referred to among educators, as one of the model organizations of the state. The schools and library are supplemented by an annual Chautauque for which Round-Up park provides space for auditorium, tents and camping privileges. A series of lyceum entertainments is

also provided during the winter season. Women's clubs, a live commercial club, much social life and a general spirit of advancement give Pendleton an educational atmosphere, both wholesome and emphasized.

Pendleton made a splendid record during the war. The high school gave numerous volunteers to the service before the draft law went into effect, as did Umatilla county. The number of golden stars in that city and county is greater than in the average community.

A Patriotic Service league and the Loyal Legion were two organizations of citizens that dealt with Liberty bond and other stickers. Occasionally there was a man who had made a fortune off the war in wheat growing, who failed to voluntarily do his part to support the young men in the service. When the two citizens' organizations, cooperating together, had applied their processes on him, there was not a man who failed to do his part, and Umatilla has the unique distinction of having no citizen who shows during Labor's Victory Week was permitted to evade his duty.

Most Popular Girl Gets Diamond Ring Says Shows Manager

A popularity contest for Pendleton girls, which will give as prizes a diamond ring and wrist watch, will be launched this week in connection with the Alamo greater shows, according to J. M. Seoby, who is here managing the show which is given under the auspices of the Round-Up band.

Candidates may send in their names to J. M. Seoby, care of the Golden Rule hotel, and each contestant whose name is sent in within the next few days will receive 100 votes free. After the donation of the 100 votes, votes will be sold at one cent each. Four booths will be established in Pendleton for the voting.

The standing of the Alamo shows is indicated by a letter of appreciation received today by Mr. Seoby from the Pocatello Central Labor Union, in recognition of his management of the shows during Labor's Victory Week in Pocatello.

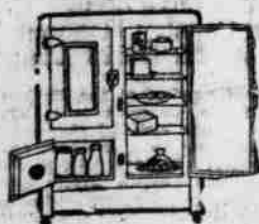
