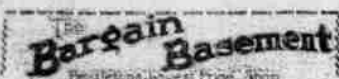

NEW YORK, June 11.—The Yankees are rather a queer baseball club. They have batting power and pitching power, but are a bit slow on the bases. Their fielding could be improved on in spots, but, considered on the whole, Yankee fielding is good enough for any big league baseball club.

Still, the Yankees are having the time of their lives sticking in the top division of Ban Johnson's circuit. Taken from top to bottom, the Yankee batting order offers potentialities that are not found on any other baseball club. In Sam Vick they have a hard hitting youngster but one who is inclined to be headstrong on the bases and a little impatient, when he gets a bat on his shoulder.

Roger Peckinpaugh is practically a cleanup hitter for most major league clubs.

Wallie Pipp is undoubtedly one of the most ferocious baseball punchers in the business, and he is followed generally by Frank Baker, another of the same kind.

Derrill Pratt is a murderous hitter and Duffy Lewis was the mainstay hitter of the Red Sox when he sojourned there. Pink Bodie is a demon clouter and Muddy Ruel is hitting far better than any one had expected.

The pitching staff has shown genuine class at times, and the hitters have been in the habit of falling down behind them.

The Yankees were slow in getting off with their real speed. I was in Florida while they were training, and noticed then that their muscles didn't respond to ordinary training treatment as most ball players. Many of them are veterans and take some time to get into condition.

Judged purely from their possibilities, the Yankees should be favorites in the dash for the pennant. The Yankees are whole and hearty. They haven't yet begun to make themselves felt as they should. Sooner or later they should start and the sparks should begin to fly. Detroit and Cleveland appear right now as most dangerous opponents for the Miller Huggins brigade, while the White Sox, of course, always figured in the race.

There is being filmed in Portland, Oregon, a drama that is certain to be one of the best and most interesting that has ever been presented to the public. This historic drama is based

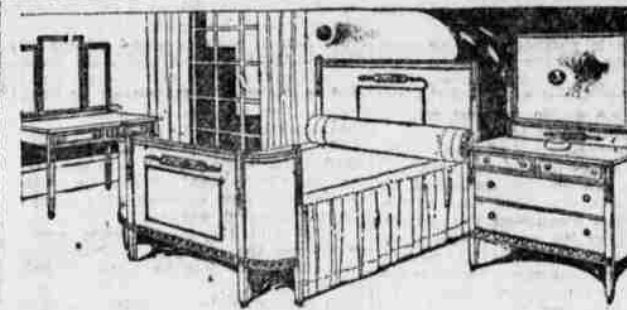
