PORTLAND, June 13.—While there were 28 cars of livestock received in the North Portland alleys overnight, 14 of these did not enter the market, being direct shipments to Northern packers. Most of the through stuff consisted of California cattle.

Market for hogs is showing a steady to firm tone generally at North Portland with small offerings for the day, half of which was a holiday.

Demand for feeder stuff is extremely good, but few pigs are coming forward and these are quickly snapped up at extreme values, quote in that line. Many moe could be sold without affecting the price in the slightest degree.

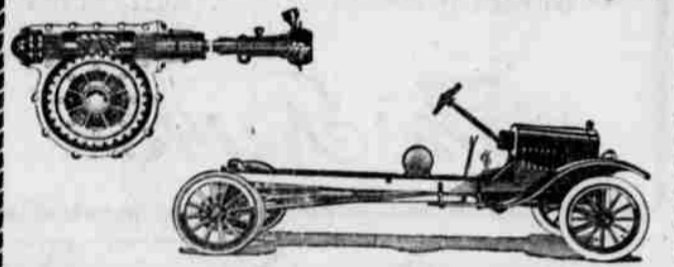
