100 PER CENT JUMP IN WOOL PRICES LIKELY

CHEYENE, Wyo., June 12.—That the wool producing situation, combined with the wool trade prospects, indicate that the price of raw wool will double within the next year, and may repeat the increase the year following, is the opinion of Isaac von Lichtenstein, manager of a large Eastern wool manufacturing concern, who is in Wyoming in connection with the procuring of contracts that will assure his concern a raw wool supply as far into the future as is possible.

"The greatest difficulty that I see ahead," said von Lichtenstein, discussing the wool supply prospects, "is that too many of the Western sheepmen—and especially those of Wyoming and Montana—are selling their sheep after the shearing season because of the prospect of continued drought and resulting prohibitive cost of feed. "I do not believe that the drought situation justifies the alarm so many flockmasters express," continued von Lichtenstein, "and even should there be a sharp advance in the price of feed I am convinced that the present demand for wool and woolen goods will double within the coming year, and possibly repeat during the year following, making wool-growing profitable, despite a possible increase in the expense of production."

"Virtually all of the sheep in Europe have been used for food," said von Lichtenstein, "and the result will be that we will have to ship mutton, wool and breeding stock to the old world."

Girl Who Won Croix de Guerre to Attempt Flight Across Ocean

NEW YORK, June 12.—Twenty-year-old Edna Nicoll, winner of the croix de guerre, conferred for bravery in the French ambulance service, arrived here Monday on La Savola, and announced her intention of attempting the trans-atlantic flight in an airplane as soon as she can get the necessary training.

"I shall make the attempt over the route from Newfoundland to Ireland," she said.

Miss Nicoll is a daughter of Dr. Alexander Nicoll of this city. At the beginning of the war she was attending a French school. She was only sixteen then, but managed to gain admission to the ambulance service. She was wounded at Verdun in 1917 and again in 1918. She also served in the Mons campaign and won a decoration for her work there.

START OFFENSIVE AGAINST BURELSON

ATLANTIC CITY, June 12.—Representatives of the Postal employees have taken steps to try to have the American Federation of Labor convention start an offensive against Postmaster General Burelson. They prepared a resolution in which it was declared "Burelson ruthlessly invaded the rights of employees and interfered in defiance of law with Postal workers' organizations." The resolution asked President Wilson to remove Burelson. It declared that Burelson sought to have repealed the constitutional right of employees to direct a petition to congress.

Reports Clashing

NEW YORK, June 12.—Western Union and Postal companies declare the strike a failure. Strike leaders say the outlook is encouraging from their standpoint. President Carlton of the Western Union issued a formal statement that of a total of 49,000 employees throughout the country only 156 failed to report for work yesterday. Carlton said there were only 11 strikers in New York. International Vice President Thomas declared 1000 Western Union and 350 Postal operators quit their jobs. Strikers are picketing the telegraph offices in a number of cities throughout the country.
