ELEVATOR MEN ASKED TO MEET IN PORTLAND

CORVALLIS, Ore., June 16, 1919.—(Editor East Oregonian.)—During the past year there has been a considerable number of complaints made by farmers of Eastern Oregon that the elevators were not proving financially

successful. It was urged that an investigation be made.

The U. S. Bureau of Markets and the Bureau of Organization and Markets of the Oregon Agricultural College have made a survey, visiting most of the elevators of Eastern Oregon.

An analysis of the elevator business shows that with the additional service rendered, most of the elevator companies cannot operate on a \$1.00 storage rate and pay expenses and a dividend on the stock. It will probably be necessary for many to increase their storage rates and also

the amount of grain handled if they wish to avoid financial loss during the coming season.

It is desirable that the elevator companies adopt a uniform practice for charging for storage and cleaning. As many as fourteen different methods are being now used in the Eastern Oregon elevators when there ought preferably to be but one.

Investigation shows that half of the elevators are under capitalization if they expect to pay for their plants from the proceeds derived from the sale of shares of stock.

In order to bring about uniformity in practices and to present further facts as to why the elevators suffered financially and with a view to adding them in overcoming past mistakes, a conference will be held at the Multnomah Hotel, Portland on Saturday, June 21, 1919. At 10 a. m. the U. S. Bureau of Markets will conduct hearings on the proposed rules and regulations of the Secretary of Agriculture under the U. S. Warehouse act of August 11, 1916, requiring warehouses (elevators included), and warehousemen storing agricultural products to take out a federal license if they handle grain for interstate or for foreign commerce.

It is very important that elevator managers and as many directors as possible be present at these two meetings. These hearings will cover all phases of elevator management and may determine the question or success.

Bogus Decorations Sold to Soldiers

WASHINGTON, June 16.—The War Department to-day issued a new warning against the sale of unofficial "Victory ribbons." Those now being sold are incorrect reproductions of the official ribbon.

"The real Victory ribbon, which eventually will be supplied to all officers and men who took part in the war, contains all the prismatic colors from violet to red, each color flowing into the next one through all the shades, so that there is no marked distinction between adjacent colors. The official ribbon is of watered silk and has a white thread on each edge.

"So far the ribbon has not been correctly reproduced in this country. A 'poured' or 'mottled' ribbon now being sold will make it unlawful to wear any official decoration, medal, button, etc., awarded by the War Department except when authorized."

NAVY URGES TAKING OF CAPE COD CANAL

WASHINGTON, June 16.—The action of the war department in urging congress to authorize the taking over of the Cape Cod canal without awaiting the outcome of pending condemnation proceedings, was prompted by the navy department. This was disclosed today by Franklin D. Roosevelt, assistant secretary of the navy.

"The Cape Cod canal during hostilities was of great value to the navy," said Mr. Roosevelt. "We utilized it frequently for the passage of naval vessels of light draught. We used it frequently in naval maneuvers and for actual warfare when submarines were off the coast."

Mr. Roosevelt said that ultimately the government hopes to have the Cape Cod Canal and the Chesapeake and Delaware canal widened and deepened sufficiently to permit all naval vessels to pass through.

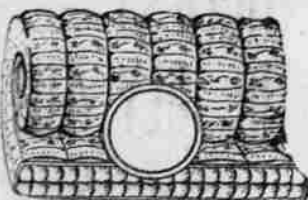
