The Lexington has made good in this territory and the local agency has become firmly established.

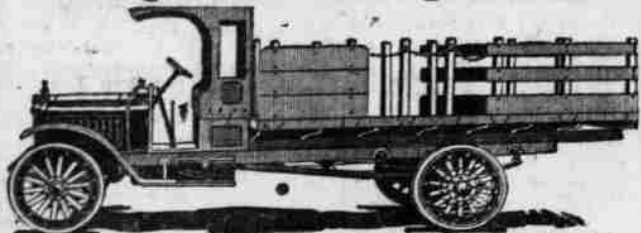

No Decrease in Price of Strawberries Strawberries are still retailing at from \$4.50 to \$5 a crate. The season for this fruit is well advanced and from all indications the price will not lower. Watermelons are selling at 10c a pound, with canteloupes at 15c each.

Grasshoppers Are Pest At Weston Mountain Grasshoppers are over-running some crops in the Weston Mountain country. An appeal to the farm departments of O. A. C. has been made in the hope of receiving information which will lead to the extermination of the destroyers. Five acres of crop belonging to Billie Hatfield were badly damaged.

Cherries Sell at 13 to 20c a Pound. Cherries are selling in the local markets at a retail price of from 13c to 20c. This price is almost double the price of cherries last year, and local merchants give as the reason the fact that Oregon canneries are buying up the fruit and thus boosting the price. Cherries are plentiful, however.
