**SEES GREAT AID TO NATION** IN WELDING OF RAILROADS

**ATLANTIC CITY, June 28**—The transportation systems of the country, when returned to their owners Jan. 1, next, are going to be up against one of the greatest constructive periods they have ever experienced," declared R. H. Ashton, President of the American Railroad Association, before the mechanical sections of that association. This opinion was shared by representatives of all the big trunk lines attending the convention.

President Ashton insisted that concentration under Government control was a very good thing for the Nation at large under the existing circumstances. He added:

"I do not believe that in the future the selfish conditions which have prevailed in the past are going to prevail in the railroad business of any other business of the country. I believe the time has come when all men must work together and I believe that the welfare of all the railroad associations into one big force is going to be in the advantage of all of us."
