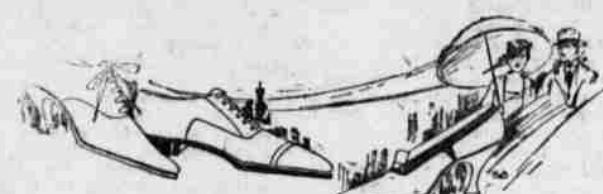

U.S. PRESIDENT TO BE FIRST TO SIGN TREATY

PARIS, June 28.—President Wilson will be the first to sign the peace treaty at Versailles. It is learned from an official source today. Following Clemenceau's announcement that the

session is opened, the secretary will carry the document from the center of the horseshoe table to the French leader, according to present plans and Clemenceau will then pass it to Wilson and possibly Lloyd George, before signing it himself.

BERLIN, June 28.—A brief machinegun battle occurred in Alexander Platz. Casualties have not been ascertained.

May Arrest "Big Fellows" For Fraud in Income Tax

NEW YORK, June 28.—Assistant United States Attorney W. L. Waid yesterday that Monday or Tuesday next week further developments would occur in the income tax investigations being made in this city under his direction.

The books of twelve or fifteen large corporations are being examined by expert accountants and internal revenue agents, and there is every reason to believe the government has been misled out of millions of dollars by falsified tax returns.

"These new firms and individuals are not connected with the cases of the Sterling Accounting and Audit Company and the Pictorial Review," said Mr. De Witt. "In due time arrests will be made of those involved, as we do not intend to allow any of the big fellows to escape justice."

Since the seizure of the Pictorial Review Company's books nearly two weeks ago, ten accountants have been busy night and day going over its records.

Interrupted Cable From President Plays Trick With B.—But Not Beer

WASHINGTON, June 27.—The telegraph instrument at the White House began clicking rapidly a cable was coming from President Wilson to Secretary Tumulty. "I've decided to go on B—," was the message the operator received. With visions of beer and light wines being saved the operator excitedly told his assistant to call Tumulty on the telephone. But after rousing the secretary the last word of the message was "billion."

WANT SIBERIAN POLICY.

WASHINGTON, June 28.—The senate today passed Senator Johnson's resolution requesting the president to inform the senate regarding the government's military policy in Siberia.

NEW FIELDS FOR 700 FIGHTERS AT LEWIS

CAMP LEWIS, June 27.—Men who went through the hell of war and came out without eyes, or arms, or legs, are being taught to become independent, despite their disability.

There are 700 of these men at the Camp Lewis base hospital who are taking this "curative" work. One of them is John Kosie. Nearly blind and being compelled to lie on his bed, he has succeeded in making two glass-bottom serving trays, a hammock, two belts and a pocketbook. He was compelled to use a powerful magnifying glass.

Private Comolo and Zolle, as the result of wounds in action, have practically paralyzed limbs. But by using a foot-power loom, they have been able to make several table runners.

Such work keeps the minds of Kosie, Zolle, Comolo and the other veterans away from their misfortunes and opens up new fields of activity for them when they are released from the hospital.

Boys Out West Are "Boys in the Bushes"

WASHINGTON, June 28.—"The boys in the bushes are not interested in international affairs, but they are intensely interested in national questions," said Will H. Hays, chairman of the Republican national committee, commenting today on his recent trip through the Middle West. Asked as to whom he referred as "the boys in the bushes," he defined the term to apply to all those except residents of the large cities of the east, and that it included residents of such cities as Cincinnati.

He declared that nearly all the people he had talked with "consider the liquor question a closed incident." He said action is demanded to solve the

railroad problem, and referred to government operation of public utilities as a "laboratory experiment" which had proved they should be returned to their owners.

He declined to add anything to his recent statement about the league of nations. The statement made at Fort Wayne, Ind., he said, was: "The settlement of peace in all the phases of the treaty is an American question, not a partisan question, and when there is an American question to settle the Republican party rises to the occasion."

He predicted that \$1,500,000,000 will be saved to the people by the present congress. Asked if he did not think it inconsistent to oppose a league of nations and also cut down the appropriations for the army and navy, he said he could see no inconsistency in such an attitude.
