PHONE STRIKERS TRY FOR NATIONWIDE AID

SAN FRANCISCO, July 11.—An appeal that the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers call a nationwide telephone workers' strike, and another appeal to Wilson to get in the deadlock were dispatched today. These are the latest developments of the strike which has paralyzed telephone communications on the Pacific coast for three weeks.

The California Federation of Labor sent the appeal to Wilson. The telegram urged him to "direct the postmaster general to recognize the right of thousands of xrl telephone operators to a living wage, and their right to collective bargaining without discrimination."

The Santa Barbara local sent the appeal for a nationwide strike to international headquarters. Power company employees in several cities placed boycott on all telephone company wires. In some cities, they say they will refuse to work any poles carrying telephone company wires.

SPOKANE MAJOR RE-ENLISTS AS ARMY PRIVATE

SPOKANE, July 11.—After serving more than 20 years in the army, returning from distinguished service in France with the title of major and being ordered out with that title, Major Frank O'Leary of 3216 Ash street, Spokane, re-enlisted at Camp Lewis as a private and has been promoted from private to a quartermaster sergeant, senior grade. He is now home on furlough and expects to receive his retirement papers soon.

Served in Philippines.

Sergeant O'Leary served in the Philippines for seven years, was in Cuba in 1898, spent part of 1916 on the Mexican border and was in the east four and a half years aside from being stationed at different forts throughout the country. While at Fort George Wright 10 years ago he was married to Miss Marie O'Leary of Spokane.

Division Adjutant in France.

At one time he was division adjutant of the 88th division in France and after the armistice was sent to Camp Lewis for discharge.

He was battalion quartermaster of the 88th division at Fort Meade, N. Y., where he was decorated with the Legion of Honor. In the result army officers suffering overseas he completed 22 years of service and was entitled to retirement, but decided to remain in the service until the war was over. He was obliged to re-enlist to be re-tired.

Captain Frank M. O'Leary, commanding company K of the Third Washington infantry, now encamped at Murfreesboro, near Tacoma, is also from Spokane.

returned from overseas after being cited for distinguished service, re-enlisted as a private and was promoted to a master signal electrician in the cable office at Seattle. He had served in the regular army.

ABOUT STARS THE GREAT BEAR

The two stars forming the front of the bow of the Big Dipper are called the Pointers, as they point almost directly to the Polar Star in whatever position the dipper happens to be located. The one at the top is known as Dubhe, an Arabian word meaning "bear." The Chinese called this star Great Bear. It is located five degrees from the one at the bottom (Merkel) and, if remembered, will be a handy yard-stick in estimating celestial distances. Dubhe is said to have been utilized in the alignment of the walls of the temple of Hather at Denderah about 5000 B. C. The star which joins the handle on the Dipper is called Megrez, the weak one, and is of the third magnitude. The next one is known as Alkaid and is a double star. One of the most important stars of this group is situated at the bend of the handle and is called Mizar. It has a fourth magnitude companion, Alcor, plainly seen with the unaided eye. A good one. The two are sometimes known as "The Horse and Rider," also as the "Cavalier." It was the first double stars observed and also the first to be photographed. The last of these famous stars, the one at the end of the handle is called Alnilad, and is known by the Chinese as "The Revolving Light."

RUTH LAW DETERMINED TO FLY ATLANTIC DESPITE SUCCESS

NEW YORK, July 11.—The success of Captain Alcock and Lieutenant Brown in making the transatlantic flight will not deter Ruth Law in her plans to attempt the cross-Atlantic flight, she declared Monday.

"The time in which the flight was made was a 'knockdown,' said the noted woman flyer. "It will be difficult for anyone to beat that record for some time to come, even under the most favorable conditions."

"I have been negotiating to make the flight in a Martin bomber. The fact that the Northcliffe prize has been won will make no difference in my plans," Miss Law's plans include a direct flight to England, her purpose being to establish a record.

ASK GRADUAL WITHDRAWAL BERLIN, July 11.—Reports received from Versailles today said the German peace delegation handed a note to Premier Clemenceau asking that Germany withdraw from the territory ceded to Poland be as gradual as possible.

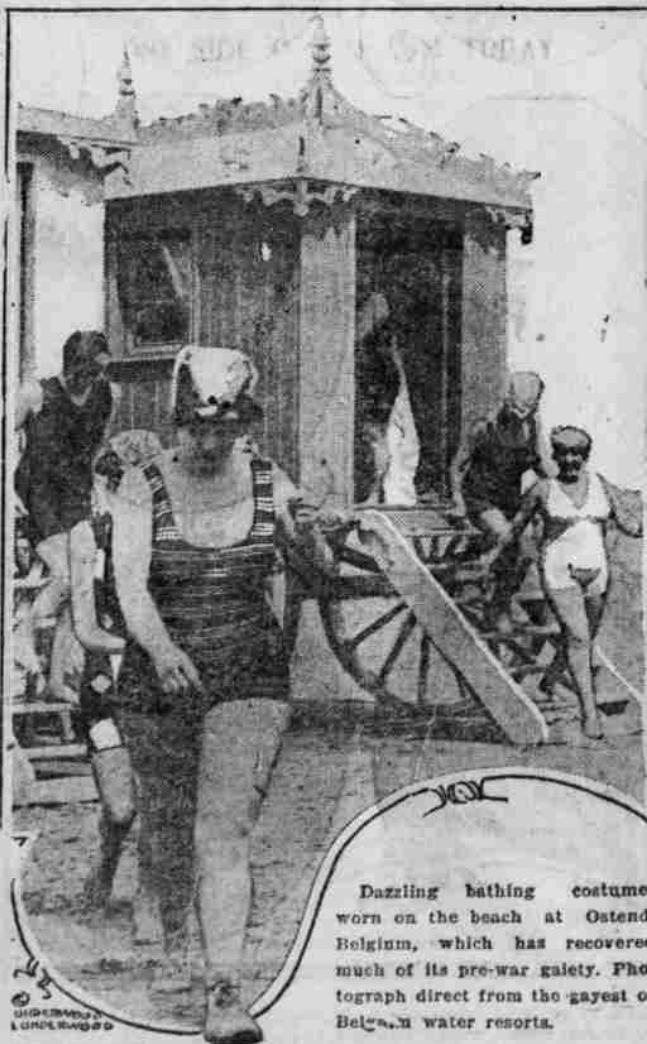

BEND, July 11.—Indicating the early development of Summer and Albert lakes, rich in mineral salts, held by Jason Moore under lease from the state, a quantity of tank lumber has arrived in Bend and is being taken to the lakes by auto truck.

The tanks will be used in evaporation ponds for complete dehydration and shipment. Just how extensive the development will be has not been given out.

MARCH CHARGES UNDUDE DELAY IN RELEASING FOOD

WASHINGTON, July 11.—The war department has \$121,000,000 worth of surplus food on hand and most of this could have been declared surplus and released to the public last February, Chief of Staff March declared today before the house committee investigating war department expenditures. He also admitted the subsistence division and quartermaster corps were open to criticism for allowing millions of pounds of ham and bacon to deteriorate in army warehouses.

March placed the blame for delay in declaring this surplus on the quartermaster's corps, authority having been given to that branch shortly after the armistice.
