Gets \$100 for Each Person Executed in Electric Chair

SING SING, N. Y., July 16.—The price paid by the state of New York for executing murderers in Sing Sing, attendants there disclosed today, has gone up. State Executioner Hulbert's fee, it develops, has been made \$100 per person electrocuted, instead of \$50, the price he took the unpopular job for. The news leaked out through prison employes, very few of whom ever find out anything about the mysterious man who pulls the switch.

When Executioner Davis, who pulled the switch that sends the current through the deadly electric chair and the occupants, resigned four years ago, the state cut down the execution fee. Davis obtained \$250 per person electrocuted. When Hulbert was appointed the fee was reduced from \$250 to \$50 per person, but awhile ago Hulbert began complaining that as wages were going up generally the state should allow him more for his services, so very quietly, the fee was increased to \$100.

Henry Teal Buys \$800,000 IN ROAD BONDS AT \$95.29

SALEM, July 16.—Henry Teal of Portland today bid in \$800,000 worth of 4 per cent state highway bonds at \$95.29, the issue netting the state \$752,290 and accrued interest. Six bidders were present this morning, representing 15 bond houses, the bids showing a fluctuation of \$8.29 on the \$1000 between the highest and lowest bid submitted. These bonds are issued under the Bean-Harriet act, which provides that the money is to be used on post roads; the state's expenditure to be matched dollar for dollar, by the federal government. According to Secretary Goddin of the state board of control a similar issue sold two years ago brought \$97.01.
