the entire world's trade into turmoil. While it had been expected for some time that the California growers were going to name a lower price than the bulk of the Oregon crop had been sold at, still the figures are lower than expected. With the sharply lower prices named by the California organization at 16c a pound, buyers have also reduced their buying quotas to a similar height and selling values will be accordingly reduced. During the last few days purchases of prune contracts in Oregon have been made up to 23c a pound for the more favorable sizes and packers will take their medicine with the growers as chief benefactors.

Estimate of Crop Is Too High.
 That the first estimate of 3,000,000 boxes of apples for Hood River valley was too high, is the impression prevailing among many of the growers here, who state that the June crop while not extensive, probably that early reports were too optimistic. However, the growing season here has been remarkable owing to the freedom of the trees from insect pests and the result will be that Hood River fruit this year will be unusually clean. Cold weather earlier in the season split the first generation of the codling moth worm, with the result of delayed spraying.

Cantaloupes Slightly Cheaper Today.
 Cantaloupes, whose rise from 10c each to 20c was an event this season, are slightly cheaper now and some are selling at 15c. Others still sell for 20c.

Green Corn Retailers at From 65c to 75c.
 Green corn, which made its first appearance this season in local markets yesterday at 80c a dozen, is selling for from 65c to 75c a dozen today. The corn comes from Yakima and other points but the product from Umatilla county producers is expected next week.

One Grade of Barley Rises 50 Cents.
 While standard A barley showed no advance over the price of \$62 a ton quoted for the past several days, standard feed barley took an upward jump of 50 cents yesterday, making the present price \$60.50. Despite the rise, mill feed was still bid at \$38, where it has been for more than a

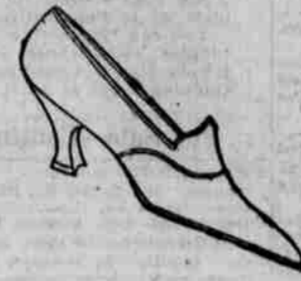
