**Carload of Watermelons Arrives in City.**  
A carload of watermelons arrived Saturday from California. The price is still 6c a pound. The season opened with a price of 10c a pound, which has since dropped.

**Cherry Season Almost Closed.**  
The cherry season in Umatilla county is almost closed, according to merchants, although a few are still coming in from Weston mountain. The varieties are Bing, Lamberts and Royal Ann.

**Forrest Delivers First Barley at Athena Mill.**  
Edgar Forrest delivered the first strain of the new crop at R. B. Richard's mill at Athena last week, according to the Press. The consignment was barley of a very good quality and was cut in a field left for the crop to volunteer last fall.

**Morrow Finds Crops Better Than Estimates**  
Previous estimates on the Morrow county wheat crop for 1919 must be revised, the Heppner Gazette-Times declares. The revision is in favor of more full sacks and a severe blow to the pessimist, for returns from the northern district are daily boosting the average yield far above the figure set. Fields that were slated for 12 and 15 bushels a few weeks ago are making from 18 to 25, and fields further north which we have not yet visited, are reported to be yielding as high as 29 bushels.

**Condensed Milk Price Not Increased Here.**  
Pendleton merchants have not yet raised the retail price of condensed milk although the wholesale price increased 30c yesterday. It is probable that the advance in retail price will not be made on the stock bought before the increase.

**50 Bushel Wheat Harvested at Weston.**  
It is reported to the Weston Leader that Marion Hansell is threshing 50-bushel wheat on his holdings between Weston and Athena.

Grain Corporation is undertaking with all trades dealing in wheat and wheat flour: "Proposed trade contracts will not be accepted by the United States Grain Corporation after July 31st except in special cases on recommendation of zone vice-presidents and upon approval by central office. License regulations governing dealers not under contract control, later to be promulgated, will probably include a rule which will require restitution to the producer in the event of purchases being made on an unfair buying margin. Decisions under this rule, it is likely, will be retroactive. Under the trade contracts proposed, the restitution rule is not retroactive, but protection is secured the producer by the contract agreement to follow the grain corporation decision at once on complaint of the producer at the time wheat is offered for sale."

**Stanfield Alfalfa Being Cut Again.**  
Second cutting of the alfalfa crop in the vicinity of Stanfield is under way now and the yield is reported as good, and in some cases better, than the first cutting several weeks ago.

**Second Strawberry Crop Being Picked.**  
C. W. Connor, of Stanfield, is harvesting a second crop of strawberries and they are classed as of excellent quality. Mr. Connor is one of the project farmers who has berries until about October 1.

**Green Corn Is Now 60c a Dozen.**  
Green corn is now selling at 60c a dozen. The corn is from Wapato, Washington, although there is a little coming in from Milton. It is expected that more corn will be in from Umatilla county growers.

**Athena Wheat Goes 50 Bushels in Places.**  
Wheat on the Richard Thompson place is going 22 sacks or nearly 50 bushels an acre the Athena Press is told. Scott Banister is getting 25 bushels of fine quality grain. On one round of Marion Hansell's field 192 sacks were filled where last year 84 sacks were filled on the same ground.

**All Meat Prices Hold Against Drop.**  
Market for hogs showed strength with a further gain in a new high record price for the week, with sales of tops up to \$22.50 or 25c above the previous high point.
