Airpostage Rate 3 Cents.
WASHINGTON, July 29.—Postmaster General Hurless has reduced the postage rate on airplane mail to 3 cents an ounce, the regular rate for first class mail matter, and placed the air mail service on the same footing with all other means of mail transportation.
The effect of the order, Second Assistant Postmaster General Otto Praeger explained, is to place all first class mail on the same basis and the question of time in mailing will determine whether a letter will go by airplane instead of by train. Letters in transit which miss train connections will be forwarded by airplane to make up the lost time, he said.
It was stated that there was no guarantee under the new arrangement that a letter would go by airplane, but that the person might go to post office stations where airplane mail sacks were made up and request that their letters be put in these sacks.
Special airplane stamps will be abandoned and letters need not be marked "via air post."
