PRISON CRUELITIES HALTED BY WILSON

Knights of Columbus Report Says "First Lady of Land" Aided in Betterment.

NEW YORK, July 30.—John W. Kehoe of No. 129 St. Nicholas Avenue, who was superintendent of hospital work for the Knights of Columbus in Paris, returned to this country yesterday with a story supporting the charges recently made that American soldier prisoners were treated brutally by some American guards in France. A statement given out by the Knights of Columbus said that in making his report to William F. Larkin, director of overseas activities, Mr. Kehoe related the following incident:

"When Mrs. Woodrow Wilson first came to Paris she was visiting Base Hospital 27 in Paris when a doughboy on a cot asked who she was. He was told that the lady was the wife of the president, and he immediately covered her to his bedside. He was covered with welts across his arms and back and apparently was in considerable pain."

"Mrs. Wilson, I wouldn't be here if it weren't for the treatment I received at La Roquette Prison," he said.

"That night Mrs. Wilson told the president and the next morning the major and the whole guard staff were brought up on charges and removed. That commanding officer of the American military prison in Paris was succeeded by Major Herriek, who has given the army prisoners the best of treatment since February."

Mr. Kehoe said the boys in that prison received no comforts until he learned of their needs from a chaplain and took a load of cigarettes, tobacco, chewing gum and writing material. He praised Major Herriek's rule, which provided for boxing and other athletics to keep the men from despondency.

U.S. PRIVATE SLAYS OWN MAJOR IN WAR

A. E. F. Soldier Arrives on Transport to Serve Fifty Years for Killing.

NEW YORK, July 30.—The transport Kaiserin Augusta Victoria, which arrived at Hoboken yesterday, brought as a military prisoner a private of the A. E. F. who had been convicted of killing his Major at the battle front. He was sentenced to fifty years. The man was in the 5th Division.

At Fort Jay, Governor's Island it was said the prisoner probably had been brought in late and no record of him would be taken until later.

Thirteen military prisoners were on the transport. Four days ago one of them escaped and no trace of him had been found up to the time the ship docked. Every officer and man of the 5,620 who came on the vessel had to pass scrutiny in leaving it.

The transport did not dock until she had lain at anchor twenty-four hours in the harbor because of fog. Her Captain G. F. Cooper, reported to Vice Admiral Gleaves that when twenty-five miles off Ambrose Lightship his vessel ran into an electrical storm that made the compass and other instruments unreliable for fifty-two minutes. The ship formerly was a Hamburg-American liner.

Radical Outbreaks Are Losing Ground

LONDON, July 31.—Radical fanaticism, or what is better known as Bolshevism, is quieting down in Britain. Here and there outbreaks continue, but they are only spasmodic and the general opinion is that any danger of an overthrow of the government except by constitutional means is unlikely.

Britain's success in combating the radicals, is credited here to the moderate manner with which the radicals were dealt with. Only once or twice was it necessary to threaten armed force and this threat did not materialize.

"Give them plenty of rope and they will hang themselves," was the attitude taken towards the extremists, with the result that the plain citizen of Britain today exhibits little sympathy with radicalism.

Though meetings were held at which extremists of the most radical type made fervent speeches to huge audiences, they failed to spur the liberal element to violence. They did help to speed labor to an awakening of its power with the result that all over the United Kingdom men and women today are earning higher wages and working shorter hours.

Though radicalism, as represented in an effort to foster a revolution, has quieted, the government still has to deal with the worker. His vast power was shown to him when the government practically surrendered to the British miners in face of a strike of the miners, railwaymen and transport workers.

Such extremists as Ramsay MacDonald and Mrs. Philip Snowden are still active. George Bernard Shaw,

the famous novelist, continues contributing his support by his ever-humorous quips and semi-serious remarks. George Lansbury is editing the London Daily Herald, Britain's labor organ, and Arthur Henderson, secretary of the Labor Party, is helping Lloyd George on the labor problem at the peace conference. All these, however, are constitutional radicals.

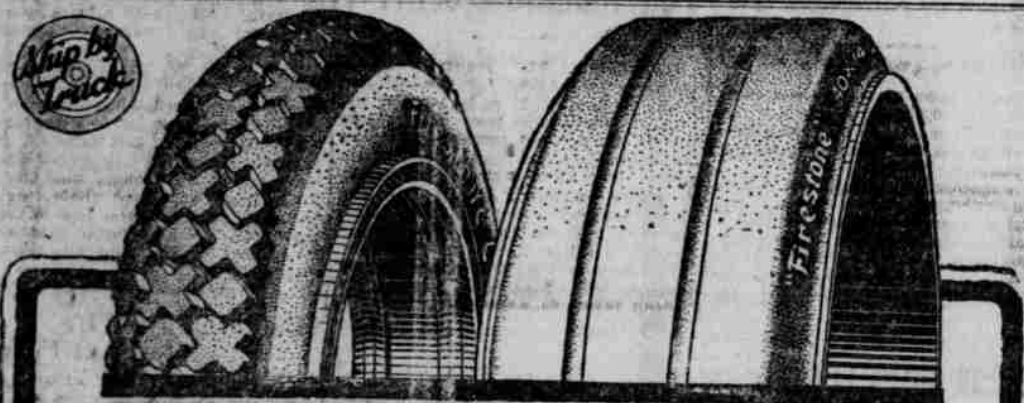
