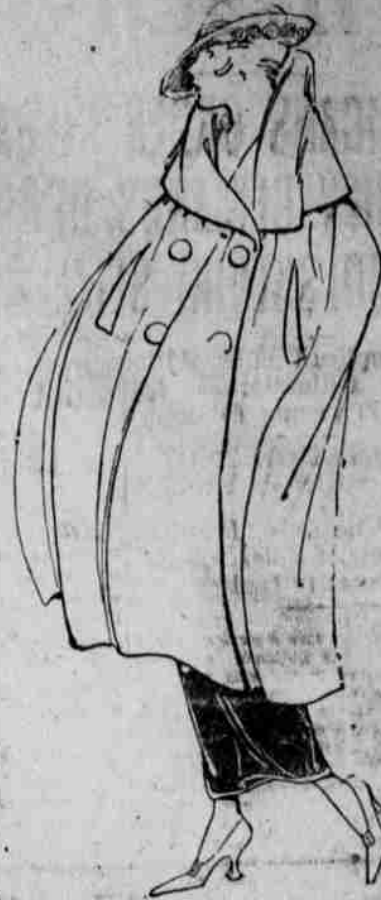

MAY CHOOSE FORM OF PAYMENT ON POLICIES

Amendment of War Risk Insurance Act Will be Urged by Legion.

Amendment of the war risk insurance act will be urged by the American Legion, through its legislative committee, in Washington, in order to allow men insured under the act to elect whether their insurance upon maturity will be paid in installments or in one lump payment.

The present form of war risk insurance is known as term insurance and is payable in monthly installments for a period of 240 months. This may be converted into ordinary forms of insurance such as straight life insurance, twenty or thirty year paid up insurance and endowment insurance. Except in the case of a matured endowment, these forms of insurance, under the present act, are payable only in installments, extending over a twenty-year period, the amount of installments depending upon the amount of insurance.

Service men say that their beneficiaries in many cases are too old ever to realize any usefulness from the insurance if paid only in monthly installments.

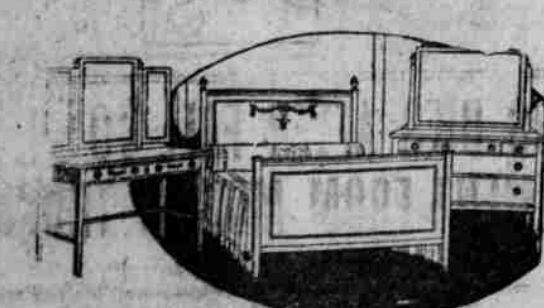
You'll find beans cooked after this fashion most satisfying and delicious. Chicken a la Maryland. Cut a young chicken at the joints. Dip in milk and flour, then in egg and the dust of cracker crumbs sifted, having first salted the chicken. Fry in a sauce pan with plenty of

butter, turning over when one piece is browned. Cover with a lid during the last five or ten minutes of the frying process, as this will make the meat juicier. About twenty minutes will be required to brown properly. Heat some cream sauce, pouring plenty of it on the platter on which the chicken is to be served. Place chicken on top of this. Serve with corn fritters, potato croquettes and broiled strips of bacon, the latter being placed on top of the chicken. Some cooks make the cream sauce

out of the butter in which the chicken has been fried. For one small chicken use a piece of butter about the size of an egg, adding a little more when the chicken is turned. When the chicken has been taken from the pan add a heaping spoonful of flour and

stir well into the butter. Then add a cup of milk and cream, half and half, seasoning afterwards with salt and pepper. Boil for five minutes. Pour on the platter in which the chicken is to be served.
