MINNEAPOLIS, July 29.—Two hundred editors representing 27 states of the union, were guests of this city Monday. They were members of the National Editorial association, are starting out on a 30 days "victory" tour of the northwest, Canada and the Pacific northwest. The national convention is to be held in four different cities—Seattle and Portland in the United States, and Victoria and Vancouver in Canada.

The party left for Winnipeg last night on a special train. Among the editors was Congressman Guy H. Hardy of Colorado, president of the National Editorial association.

TOKIO, Aug. 8.—Advices from Antung, Manchuria, on the border of northern Corea, tell of continued outrages by Chinese mounted bandits on the upper reaches of the Yalu river. A band of several hundred raided the police station at Changbu and carried away arms and ammunition. On the following day the residences of the wealthy people were attacked and sacked of their contents.
