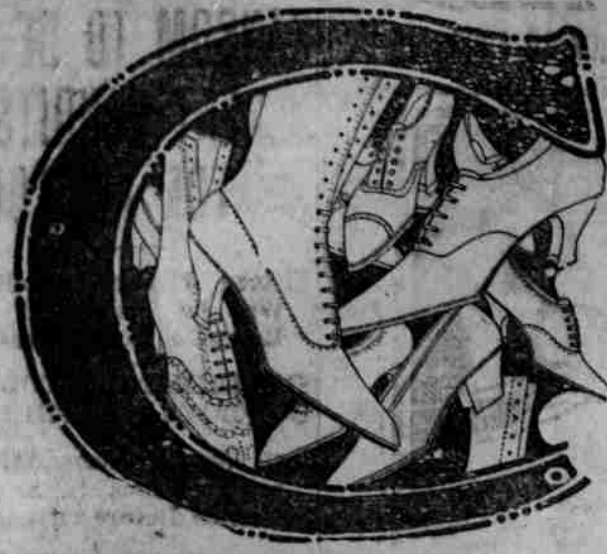

SEVERAL FINED FOR LEAVING CAMP FIRES

PORTLAND, Aug. 15.—A fire which burned over twenty-five acres on the Fremont National Forest here, it was surrounded was found to have originated in the sheep camp of Kellaher & Flynn, probably set by

ashes from Kellaher's pipe. Mr. Flynn agreed to accept the responsibility in Kellaher's behalf and went before Justice of the Peace J. S. Smith, who fined him ten dollars. Flynn paid the fine and agreed that his men would care for the fire until it was out. This fire was reported almost simultaneously by Forest Service lookout men stationed on Hager Mountain and Bald Mountain.

August 2, L. J. Stock and W. F. Smith, campers on the Rammer National Forest, were arrested by Deputy

Supervisor Penby at Yakima and taken before Justice Roy C. King, where they pleaded guilty to leaving camp fires unextinguished. A recommendation of leniency was made, and the men were fined ten dollars and costs. For leaving a campfire unextinguished in Grays Gulch, on the Whitman National Forest, on August 5, O. P. Potter, camp tender for Spray & Tappleton, of Spray, Oregon, pleaded guilty before Don L. Willard, Justice of the peace at Sumpter, Oregon and was fined twenty-five dollars. The fire was discovered and put out by Forest Ranger Charles F. Groom before it had gained any headway.

The "hot stuff" plant, recently destroyed by fire at Adams, has been rebuilt and is in operation again the Athena Press says. The gap between Adams and Blakesley is being drawn together, and in a short time the highway will be hard surfaced from Adams to Pendleton. A stretch on hard surface already extends from Adams this way, and from now on, work will be centered on the Athena-Milton section, with plants and big outfits on each end, working toward the center of operations.

MEXICAN BORDER STILL VERY WET

LAREDO, Tex., Aug. 16.—Enforcement of nation-wide prohibition may offer a hard problem to peace officers in the inland states but their job is a sinecure to that of federal officials trying to keep the American side of the Mexican border dry.

Prohibition in the United States has offered a means of wealth to hundreds of adventurous spirits along the Rio Grande and booze smuggling is being made a fine art.

All the fiery Mexican drinks—mescal, aguardiente and tequila—sell readily in the states and smuggling is comparatively easy since the twelve hundred odd miles of border generally is sparsely settled and patrolled only by small military units.

The wily Mexican, trailing his mescal in bladders, hog skins and goat skins, wades the Rio Grande at night, disposes of his wares and is back in Mexico again long before the dawn. When the mescal jacks punch, he spikes it with red pepper, onions or drugs and the result is a knock-out which backs Jack Dempsey's uppercuts into the shade.

Spiked soda water is another means of avoiding detection. Recently a Mexican, with a cargo of apparently harmless, pink, soda-water, was stopped by customs agents, who sampled his wares. The soda water was pink in appearance only. It's kick beat any American "Red-Eye" known.

In one week recently, in the town of Alice, Jim Wells County, customs agents found more than 500 quarts of mescal.

The 1919 apple crops in the Walla Walla valley is selling for record prices the Milton Eagle says. Buyers are plentiful and willing to pay the price. The demands for northwest apples and an extreme shortage of this fruit in eastern states is believed to stimulate prices in the northwest.
