## ANONYMOUS DONOR IS FAIRY GOD FATHER TO MASSACHUSETTS TECH.

Man Known Only as "Mr. Smith" Will Add Other Million to Fund Declares Gen. du Pont; Campaign to Open.

NEW YORK, Aug. 25.—In announcing last night plans for accumulating an endowment fund of \$10,000,000 for the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Gen. T. Coleman du Pont explained the institute has a "mysterious fairy godfather" who already has contributed \$7,000,000 and will give \$4,000,000 more provided from \$4,000,000 to \$5,000,000 can be obtained from other sources. The donor is referred to as "Mr. Smith" and his real identity is known to only Dr. Richard C. Maclaurin, a member of the committee which will solicit funds.

The campaign for the \$10,000,000 fund is to open at once and continue until Jan. 1, according to Gen. du Pont, who emphasized the need for highly trained engineers and technicians in America at this time when intensive competition is to follow the

world's return to peace-time conditions, and about \$5,000,000 must be endowed, he added, if "Massachusetts Tech" is to pay its faculty adequately and furnish accommodations for its increasing number of students.

"To insure industrial supremacy," said Dr. Maclaurin, "we must have trained men, and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology stands prominently as a most successful school in educating men for this task. This is reason enough why a man interested in industries should contribute toward the work 'Tech' is doing."

Besides its Chairman, Gen. du Pont, the committee which will strive to raise the endowment comprises Dr. Maclaurin, Theodor N. Vail, Charles A. Stone, Otto H. Kahn, Charles Hayden, Everett Morse and Edmund Hayes.

## PARDONED YANKS MAKE GOOD IN LATER FIGHT, ONE OF MEN IS KILLED

WASHINGTON, Aug. 25.—One of the two American soldiers sentenced to death for sleeping on outpost duty in France and subsequently pardoned by President Wilson, was killed in the great Alame offensive in July, 1918, and the other was twice wounded and finally honorably discharged.

This was disclosed Thursday by an exchange of correspondence between Secretary Baker and President Wilson. Private Forest P. Sebastian, of 27 Dorado, Ill., 29 years old, was killed in

the Alame battle. Private Jeff Cook of Lufie, Okla., aged 19, was wounded in the same battle, but recovered to again fight gallantly in the Argonne offensive, where he received his second wound.

In writing the president of the gallant conduct of the boys after the president had pardoned them, Secretary Baker said:

"You will recall that early in 1918 four death sentences were presented to you from France, two for disobedience of orders; you remitted to terms of imprisonment, and two young boys Sebastian and Cook, who were convicted of sleeping on outpost duty, you fully pardoned."

"It will interest you to know that upon restoration to duty both made good soldiers. Sebastian died in battle in the Aisne offensive in July, 1918. Cook was wounded in that battle and restored to health in time to fight in the Meuse-Argonne battle, when he again fought gallantly, and was for the second time wounded. He has been now restored to health thru medical attention and has been honorably discharged from the service."

President Wilson in acknowledging the secretary's letter wrote:

"Thank you for your thoughtfulness in telling me about the records made by Sebastian and Cook, the two youngsters who were pardoned for sleeping on outpost duty. It is very delightful to know that they redeemed themselves so thoroughly."

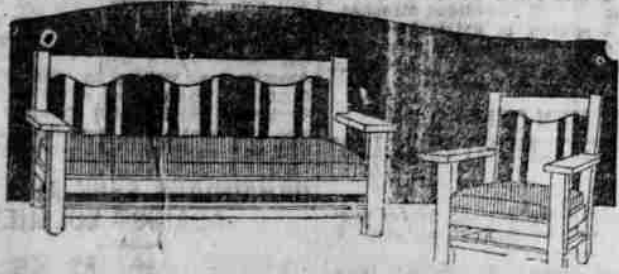
