CONDITIONS IN FAR EAST MOST PATHETIC
SAYS CHARLES CRANE

PARIS, France, Aug. 29.—Conditions throughout Asia Minor are most pathetic. Charles Crane, head of the American mission to the near east, declared upon his return from Constantinople. "During three months," he said, "we visited 200 towns and villages. Despite reserve, the delegations without exception unburdened themselves to us, indicating that all British hopes and ambitions are tied up in the belief the United States will help them." He said the mission didn't have time to visit Armenia but stated reports indicated conditions there were "extremely distressing."

puty potentate for Pendleton, and answers, most of them in the affirmative are being received daily. Efforts are being made to have the fullest possible representation from the city and county.

Ten or twelve candidates for admission to the mystic shrine will accompany the party to La Grande. Candidates from all of Eastern Oregon will be there and the Portland nobles, who will conduct the ceremonial, have promised that the sands will be very hot.

In all probability Pendleton will be treated to a Sunday morning concert by the Shriner band upon the return of the special train, Sunday Sept. 7. The temple carries its own band of about 40 pieces and W. J. Hoffman, illustrious potentate, has offered to have the special train stop here for an hour and a half Sunday to give this city a concert.

Because of the close proximity to the Round-Up, Pendleton made no effort to have the ceremonial here, but later, when the city can do justice to the temple, the nobles will be invited to Pendleton to hold a ceremonial. Meanwhile the Pendleton Shriners are getting behind the La Grande ceremonial with all their might and expect to help make it one of the best events in Eastern Oregon fraternal history.
